Senior Planner Keith Niederer gave a PowerPoint presentation (attached), on the proposed Villas 136 non-major general plan amendment and rezoning (2-GP-2013 and 4-ZN-2013) request. He explained that the proposed height and finished floor elevations for each building are outlined in the stipulations.

Applicant representative John Berry explained that the applicant's request downzones a failed shopping center to a residential quality, high-end condominium community. He believes that the reduced building heights will address neighbors' concerns about loss of scenic views.

Finance Manager Lee Guillory gave a PowerPoint presentation (attached) on the proposed Fiscal Year 2013/14 property tax levy.

Discussion:

- Ms. Guillory said the Truth in Taxation notice that was published in the Arizona Republic stated the Council may increase the property tax rate by 2%. The Council's decision on whether to include the 2% allowance will determine whether there is a Truth in Taxation hearing tonight. If the total primary levy amount exceeds the prior year's levy, after added growth into the FY 2013/14 year has been taken out, a Truth in Taxation hearing is required.
- In response to a question, Ms. Guillory advised that if the Council decides to lower the tax rate, thus reducing the levy, the budget will not be in balance.
- Ms. Guillory confirmed that the increase in the levy is due to \$237,000 in new construction. There is also a slight reduction due to tort recovery.
- In response to a question, Ms. Guillory confirmed that the average homeowner may see a slight increase in property taxes, even if their assessed value remains exactly the same as last year, because the overall City's valuations dropped.

Ms. Guillory explained that up until two years ago, APS and SRP districts performed their own maintenance and built the cost into the billing for each district. SRP no longer maintains their streetlight districts. The City must absorb the cost of maintaining SRP's districts because State Statute restricts the City's billing to energy costs only.
