Mayor Lane: AS PART OF THE MAYOR'S REPORT, WE'VE GOT A BIT OF AN EXCITING ACCOLADE THAT WE RECEIVED TODAY, AND GOOGLE HAS NAMED SCOTTSDALE THE 2013 eCITY OF ARIZONA. AND THIS eCITY AWARD RECOGNIZES SCOTTSDALE AS THE STRONGEST ONLINE BUSINESS COMMUNITY IN THE STATE. AND IT IS A GREAT CREDIT TO OUR BUSINESSES, AND IT IS A GREAT CREDIT TO THE PRIVATE INVESTMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE, HARD WIRED AND WIRED. AND CREATING AN ENVIRONMENT THAT IS SO RECEPTIVE AND ATTRACTIVE FOR E-COMMERCE AND DIGITAL ECONOMY. SO THAT IS AN INTERESTING CONVERSATION TODAY WITH A RADIO STATION THAT ASKED WHAT OUR SECRET WAS TO THIS. ## ITEM 8 – MONTHLY FINANCIAL UPDATE

Mayor Lane: THE NEXT ITEM ON OUR REGULAR AGENDA IS ITEM EIGHT WHICH IS THE MONTHLY FINANCIAL UPDATE AND I BELIEVE WE HAVE JOYCE GILBRIDE HERE TO MAKE THAT PRESENTATION.

Accounting Director Joyce Gilbride: MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL, THIS IS THE MONTHLY FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR THE FIRST MONTH OF THE FISCAL YEAR, JULY 2013. BEGINNING WITH GENERAL FUND OPERATING SOURCES, AND WE'RE SHOWING AN OVERALL POSITIVE VARIANCE TO BUDGET OF 4% OR .8 MILLION. WHEN LOOKING AT OUR ACTUAL TO ACTUAL COMPARISONS, WE'RE REALIZING A 13% INCREASE OVER THE SAME PERIOD IN THE PRIOR YEAR. AND JUST TOUCHING ON A FEW OF THE ITEMS ARE 1% GENERAL PURPOSE SALES TAX. IT IS COMING IN 2% ABOVE OUR FORECAST. AND LOOKING DOWN AT THE AUTO LIEU YOU SEE AN UNFAVORABLE VARIANCE THERE AT 51% HOWEVER WE DID ONLY RECEIVE HALF OF OUR ALLOTMENT IN THE MONTH OFJULY. SHORTLY AFTER THAT IN AUGUST WE SHOULD RECEIVE THE OTHER HALF, SO THAT SHOULD RESOLVE ITSELF NEXT MONTH.

SKIPPING DOWN TO MISCELLANEOUS REVENUE, BUILDING PERMITS, AND INTEREST EARNINGS. ALL THREE OF THOSE CATEGORIES EXCEEDED THE JULY FORECAST BY 100% OR MORE. AND ALTHOUGH WE CAN'T REALLY DRAW ANY CONCLUSIONS FROM ONE MONTH OF ACTIVITY, YOU'LL NOTICE THAT THE BUILDING PERMITS DID COME IN AT \$1.5 MILLION VERSUS A BUDGET OF .7 MILLION, SO THAT IS SIMILAR TO THE ACTIVITY WE'RE SEEING AT THE LATER PORTION OF LAST YEAR'S FISCAL YEAR. AND THEN LOOKING AT THAT 2% FAVORABLE VARIANCE IN DETAIL FOR THE 1% SALES TAX, YOU CAN SEE THERE ARE TWO CATEGORIES UNDER CONSUMER SPENDING THAT EXCEEDED BUDGET, AND THAT IS OUR MISCELLANEOUS GOODS AND SERVICES COMING IN AT 36% ABOVE OUR FORECAST, AND THEN, AGAIN, AUTO SALES AND MAINTENANCE COMING IN AT 7% ABOVE FORECAST. AGAIN, ANOTHER TREND WE SAW FROM THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR.

AND THEN IF WE'RE LOOKING AT OUR ACTUAL TO ACTUAL, WE'RE AT ABOUT 8% HIGHER THAN WE WERE AT THE SAME PERIOD PRIOR FISCAL YEAR. AND THEN THIS GRAPH SHOWS THE CHANGE IN THE 1% SALES TAX COLLECTION YEAR OVER YEAR FOR THE MONTH OF JULY. AGAIN, WE'RE 8% HIGHER THAN WE WERE IN JULY OF 2012. YOU'LL NOTICE OUR 4% OVERALL FORECAST FOR THE FISCAL YEAR. WE HAVE EXCEEDED THAT AT LEAST FOR THE MONTH OF JULY COMING IN AT 8% OVER THE PRIOR YEARS. YOU'LL ALSO NOTICE THAT THE MONTH OF JUNE IS NOT SHOWING ON OUR GRAPH AT THIS POINT. WE'RE STILL IN THE PROCESS OF CLOSING OUT OUR PRIOR FISCAL YEAR AND PREPARING FOR THE ANNUAL AUDIT, HOWEVER, WE DO HAVE PRELIMINARY FIGURES THAT SHOWED THAT THE TOTAL 1% COLLECTION CAME IN AT ABOUT \$88 MILLION, WHICH IS ABOUT 5% OVER THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR.

AND THEN MOVING TO GENERAL FUND OPERATING USES BY CATEGORIES, TOTAL PERSONNEL SERVICES SHOWING AN UNFAVORABLE VARIABLE OF 1% OR .1 MILLION. IN OUR OVERTIME CATEGORY, WE ARE SHOWING .2 MILLION UNFAVORABLE VARIANCE. THAT IS OCCURRING PRIMARILY IN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT. ABOUT \$10 5,000 VARIANCE THERE AND ABOUT A \$60,000 UNFAVORABLE VARIANCE IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. LOOKING AT OUR CONTRACTUAL, COMMODITIES AND CAPITAL OUTLAY, WE'RE SHOWING A FAVORABLE VARIANCE OF .4 MILLION GOING DOWN TOWARD THE SERVICES AND CONTRACT AND TRANSFERS OUT WE HAVE HAD NO ACTIVITY SO FAR IN THE FISCAL YEAR BRINGING US TO A GRAND TOTAL OF 2% FAVORABLE VARIANCE OR .3 MILLION. Mayor Lane: EXCUSE ME. ON THE OVERTIME NUMBER, WE HAD ALLOCATED SOME ONE-TIME FUNDS FOR THE STAFFING ON 602, AND I THINK THAT WAS GOING TO BE APPLIED TOWARD OVERTIME. IS THAT INCLUDED IN THIS NUMBER, IN OTHER WORDS, ARE WE EXCEEDING THAT AMOUNT OR IS IT NOT INCLUDED IN THOSE OVER-TIME NUMBERS?

Joyce Gilbride: MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL, I'LL DEFER TO EITHER THE BUDGET DIRECTOR OR THE CITY MANAGER FOR THAT.

Budget Director Judy McIlroy: MAYOR AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL, WE DO HAVE THE \$400,000 ALLOCATED THROUGHOUT THE FISCAL YEAR, SO THAT IS INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET NUMBER. THEY ARE CURRENTLY EXCEEDING WHAT WAS PLANNED. WE DO HAVE STAFF COMING BACK SOMETIME IN SEPTEMBER TO SHARE WITH YOU THEIR PROPOSAL RELATED TO OVERTIME OR THE ADDITIONAL FTE'S.

Mayor Lane: OKAY. THANK YOU.

Joyce Gilbride: AND THEN LOOKING AT USES BY DIVISION, MOST OF THE VARIANCES THAT YOU SEE, THE UNFAVORABLE VARIANCES ARE DUE TO TIME DIFFERENCES. WE'RE JUST IN THE FIRST MONTH OF THE FISCAL YEAR. UNDER ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES, THERE WAS A SOFTWARE LICENSE EXPENSE THAT HIT IN JULY, BUT IT WAS BUDGETED IN AUGUST. UNDER PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONAL AREA, YOU'RE SEEING AN UNFAVORABLE VARIANCE OF 25%. AGAIN, THAT WAS DUE TO A PURCHASE OF I BELIEVE THE CAD SOFTWARE THAT OCCURRED IN JULY THAT WAS NOT BUDGETED TO OCCUR UNTIL AUGUST. PUBLIC SAFETY, FIRE, THE UNFAVORABLE VARIANCE OF .1 MILLION, AND THAT IS PRIMARILY THE OVERTIME THAT WE DISCUSSED. AND THEN LOOKING AT PUBLIC WORKS, A POSITIVE VARIANCE OF 48%, AND THAT IS DUE TO THE ELECTRICITY PAYMENT, THE BILLS THAT COME IN JULY ARE ACTUALLY FOR JUNE SERVICE. SO WE DO HAVE TO BOOK THOSE BACK TO THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR, BUT WE DID HAVE THE BUDGET IN JULY, SO WE HAD ABOUT \$500,000 BUDGETED BUT ZERO EXPENSE, AND THAT I BELIEVE WE ARE REALLOCATING THAT BUDGET, SO WE SHOULDN'T SEE THAT VARIANCE GOING FORWARD SO THEN, AGAIN, IN TOTAL 2% FAVORABLE VARIANCE SO FAR OF OUR EXPENDITURES OF .3 MILLION. AND THIS SLIDE SUMMARIZES OUR SOURCES AND USES FOR THE MONTH OF JULY AND THAT CONCLUDES OUR PRESENTATION. I WOULD BE HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS.

Vice Mayor Klapp: THANK YOU, MAYOR. THE COUNCIL WILL BE NOMINATING SCOTTSDALE RESIDENTS INTERESTED IN SERVING ON SEVEN CITIZEN ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS. THE SEVEN WITH VACANCIES ARE THE AIRPORT ADVISORY COMMISSION, THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT, HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION, JUDICIAL APPOINTMENT ADVISORY BOARD, LOSS TRUST FUND BOARD, PLANNING COMMISSION AND THE TOURISM DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION.
