Arizona Public Service Company Peak Solutions Rebate

Water Resources Executive Director Brian Biesemeyer will be joined by a representative from Arizona Public Service to discuss the City's energy reduction efforts. APS will present a \$150,000 rebate check to the City.

- Water Resources Executive Director Brian Biesemeyer reported on the City's efforts to conserve energy through the Peak Solutions Program. Vern Braaksma, representing the Arizona Public Service Company, presented the City with a rebate check for \$153,000. Mayor Lane thanked City staff for their efforts to conserve energy.
