8. City's Proposed Fiscal Year 2014/15 Rates and Fees

- Councilman Robbins made a motion to accept the proposed FY 2014/15 rates and fees as presented, except for the youth sports field fees, which would later come back to Council for approval. Mayor Lane seconded the motion, which carried 4/3, with Vice Mayor Korte and Councilmembers Klapp and Milhaven dissenting.
- Mayor Lane made a motion that the increase in Police Department off-duty holiday and incentive pay rates be limited to no more than a \$5.00 increase. The motion died for lack of a
- Mayor Lane made a motion not to increase the Police Department off-duty holiday and incentive pay rates and to direct staff to come back with information on the market rates. Councilwoman Milhaven seconded the motion, which carried 4/3, with Vice Mayor Korte and Councilmembers Littlefield and Phillips dissenting.

 City Attorney Bruce Washburn clarified that the motions for this item were for the purpose of providing direction to staff. The final adoption of the proposed rates and fees will be agendized for a later date.
