19. <u>Scottsdale Road Hotel Trolley</u>

- Councilman Littlefield made a motion to adopt the Transportation Director's recommendation to not continue the Day Tripper trolley service, except for the two week period during the Super Bowl (January 21 to February 3, 2015). Councilmember Korte seconded the motion, which failed 3/4, with Vice Mayor Phillips and Councilmembers Klapp, Milhaven, and Robbins dissenting.
- Councilwoman Milhaven made a motion to direct staff to: move forward with the three-month trolley program; work with the TDC to consider extending the route to the transit center in Tempe; and come back to Council with a report, pulled from the Transportation Department and from Tourism, on this year's program before the 2015 summer break. Councilman Robbins seconded the motion, which carried 5/2, with Mayor Lane and Councilman Littlefield dissenting.
- Councilman Littlefield proposed an amendment to add that if the trolley program does not work after one more year the City would cancel the service. Motion died for lack of a second.
