Councilwoman Littlefield seconded the motion, which failed 2/4, with Mayor Lane, Vice Mayor Smith, and Councilwomen Klapp and Milhaven dissenting.
- Vice Mayor Smith made a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 4225 establishing the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee in the event that any or all of the bond questions are passed by the Scottsdale qualified electors at the November 3, 2015 election. Councilwoman Milhaven seconded the motion, which carried 5/1, with Councilman Phillips dissenting.

 - The desire to keep the bridge open for trolleys, cart carriages, and pedestrian traffic;
 - Impact on the limited parking in the area;
 - The duration and timing of the event due to impacts on Art Walk; specifically, eliminating the event on Thursday nights so that it does not compete with Art Walk;
 - The concerns and opinions of all interested parties; and
 - The possibility that based on the Manager's review and findings, actions taken by the City Manager may include modifying or rescinding the permit.
- 2. As soon as possible, provide a report to the Council at a future meeting regarding findings and results of the Manager's review.
 - Vice Mayor Smith seconded the motion, which carried 4/2, with Mayor Lane and Councilwoman Milhaven dissenting.
- Mayor Lane made an alternate motion to direct the City Manager to review the Artisan Market special event permit and work with the applicant/permittee and interested parties to mediate concerns for the 2015 permit, while staff proceeds with the special events ordinance outreach process. The motion died for lack of a second.
- Councilman Phillips made a motion to rescind the Artisan Market special event permit. Vice Mayor Smith seconded the motion. The motion was withdrawn.
