MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Ortega welcomed everyone back from summer break and noted it was an exciting time as the school year had started.

Mayor Ortega stated that August is Drowning Prevention Month, noting the importance of pool safety. Over 200 people participated in the City's free learn-to-swim lessons with Scottsdale Aquatics, which was funded, in part, with a grant from the USA Swimming Youth Learn to Swim Program.

Mayor Ortega discussed the devastation caused by recent fires in the city of Lahaina and Maui. He explained that Lahaina and Scottsdale have several things in common, noting the family of Hartley and Ruth Barker were original settlers in Maui and sponsored the Boys and Girls Club in both Scottsdale and Lahaina, which was destroyed in the fires. Mayor Ortega asked for a moment of silence for the city of Lahaina and the grieving families in Maui.



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General Fund Local Sales Tax - Preliminary FY22/23




