

The 100 Club of Arizona's Safety Enhancement Stipend (SES) program was created in 2004 to provide assistance to public safety agencies for equipment to enhance the safety of officers and firefighters. The SES Program allows agencies to obtain equipment and training that is otherwise unavailable through other funding. Arizona's first responders run head first into danger to protect our communities; we want to help protect them while they do that.

Imagine a crew of firefighters responding to a house fire wearing turnout gear that is tattered and torn. Imagine a police officer entering into an active shooter scene while wearing an expired bulletproof vest. These situations may seem improbable, but the harsh reality is that many rural departments simply cannot afford to supply their first responders with up to date safety equipment. Items such as turnout gear, self-contained breathing apparatus', ballistic shields, and service dogs can become very expensive. The Safety Enhancement Stipend program gives agencies the opportunity to obtain crucial safety equipment to keep their first responders safe. In 2016, the Safety Enhancement Stipend program provided \$172,040 in safety equipment to public safety agencies in need.
