A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, ESTABLISHING A TRANSPORTATION SAFETY ZONE

WHEREAS, A.R.S §9-499.18 authorizes cities and towns to establish Transportation Safety Zones within their municipal boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered the traffic safety data contained in Exhibit A of this Resolution and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the establishment of a Transportation Safety Zone within the City of Scottsdale, contained within the boundaries of Exhibit B of this Resolution and incorporated herein by this reference, is necessary to preserve the public health, safety and general welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Scottsdale, Arizona, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to A.R.S. §9-499.18, the City Council after considering the traffic safety data set forth in Exhibit A finds that it is necessary to establish a Transportation Safety Zone with boundaries as set forth in Exhibit B, in order to preserve the public health, safety and general welfare.

The Proposed Transportation Safety Zone boundary is: 68th Street, Osborn Road, Miller Road, and Camelback Road, inclusive. The right-of-way for all four boundary streets is included in **Exhibit 1** of Resolution 9955. The involved area is approximately 1.25 square miles.

The following thirteen (13) intersections of major streets are within the proposed zone:

68th Street and Osborn Road

The following twenty (20) major roadway segments are within the proposed zone:

Goldwater Boulevard: Indian School Road to Camelback Road

Scottsdale Road: Osborn Road to Indian School Road

For every even-numbered year, the City Transportation Department collects Traffic Volume and Collision Rate Data. Of the thirteen major street intersections in the proposed Transportation Safety Zone, two are in the highest twenty for collision number or collision rate of the 189 major intersections throughout Scottsdale for the year 2012. For the years 2010, 2008, 2006, 2004, and 2002; two to four of the thirteen proposed Transportation Safety Zone intersections were in the highest twenty collision experience intersections citywide.

Of the twenty major street segments in the proposed Transportation Safety Zone, four are in the highest twenty for collision number or collision rate of the 321 major street segments throughout Scottsdale for the year 2012. For the years 2010, 2008, 2006, 2004, and 2002; four to eight of the twenty proposed Transportation Safety Zone intersections were in the highest twenty collision experience segments citywide.

There are approximately 114 establishments with liquor licenses per-square-mile within the proposed Transportation Safety Zone boundary. There are approximately 4 establishments with liquor licenses per-square-mile citywide in Scottsdale.




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
