On April 16, 1963, the Council adopted Resolution No. 249 creating the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Growth of Scottsdale, and specifying the functions of the Committee. The Committee was to provide a report regarding:

- A. Development of tourist and convention facilities.
- B. Development of airport facilities.
- C. Development of municipal buildings and land including a municipal office complex, fire protection facilities, and a library and cultural center.
- D. Development of parks and recreation centers.
- E. Development of streets, expressways, arterials, and rights-of-way for future streets.
- F. Development of a water system and sewers.
- G. Development of financing for long range programs.
- H. Development of ways and means including recommendations for revised legislation to implement the capital improvement program.
- I. Development of publicity and public relations.

Guy Stillman was appointed as the chair of the Committee.
