**Letter To The Scottsdale City Council From The Sonoran Heights Homeowners Assoc.  
Re: Submission of Citizen Petitions Objecting To The Construction Of An Eight-Foot-  
Wide, One-Half-Mile-Long Concrete Sidewalk Over Desert Terrain, Including Protected  
Lands Within the McDowell Sonoran Preserve**

Mayor Lane, Members of the Scottsdale City Council: My name is Fred Leeder and I live at 12589 East Laurel Lane in Sonoran Heights, a community of 263 homes, located immediately adjacent to the McDowell Sonoran Preserve, between 124th and 128th Streets.

I come before you this evening, as the designated representative of our HOA, to submit petitions signed by more than two-thirds of our homeowners objecting to the construction of this sidewalk and the still-threatened closing of one of our three community gates and the connected segment of Cactus Road, which we have used for 25 years to access our homes.

Actually, you may well be familiar with the Transportation Department's plans for the "Cactus Path" or what used to be called the "Anasazi Multi-Use Path." Many of our homeowners have been objecting to it for almost four years, since the plans were first made public. And for more than a year, now, we have been promised the opportunity by Mr. Basha, the acting City Manager and the Transportation Commission to present our petitions to you and to present our case to you, as to why this sidewalk and its shoulders, requiring a total swath of 12 feet of desert terrain destruction for a half mile must not be constructed.

But this morning, strangely enough, our attorney received a phone call from Mr. Basha informing us that the City Manager has decided we will not have the opportunity to get on the City Council's Agenda.

And so, the Sonoran Heights Community requests that you accept and acknowledge receipt of our petitions and that you consider our appeal to make a motion on, and vote to direct the City Manager to agendize the petitions for further discussion, allowing the Sonoran Heights Community to address the City Council in regular session on a future date, regarding our chief concerns. They are:

- The lack of a proper study of environmental damage resulting from the clearing, excavating and pouring of concrete over a half-mile of environmentally-sensitive desert terrain, 12-foot wide.
- The changing of flash-flood drainage patterns into our Community and close to some of our homes, resulting from the pavement across natural washes, around which our Community was originally designed and laid out. We have seen no specific plans or details addressing this potentially disastrous flooding problem.
- The use, in part, of McDowell Sonoran Preserve protected land for this wide concrete pavement, or its conversion to unprotected land, which we believe may not have been publicly discussed, properly authorized, or perhaps not consistent with legal requirements for such conversion.

Our homeowners believe that should you agree to review these issues and hear our case supporting our citizen petitions, you will agree that this project should not be constructed, and should be removed from the Transportation Master Plan.
