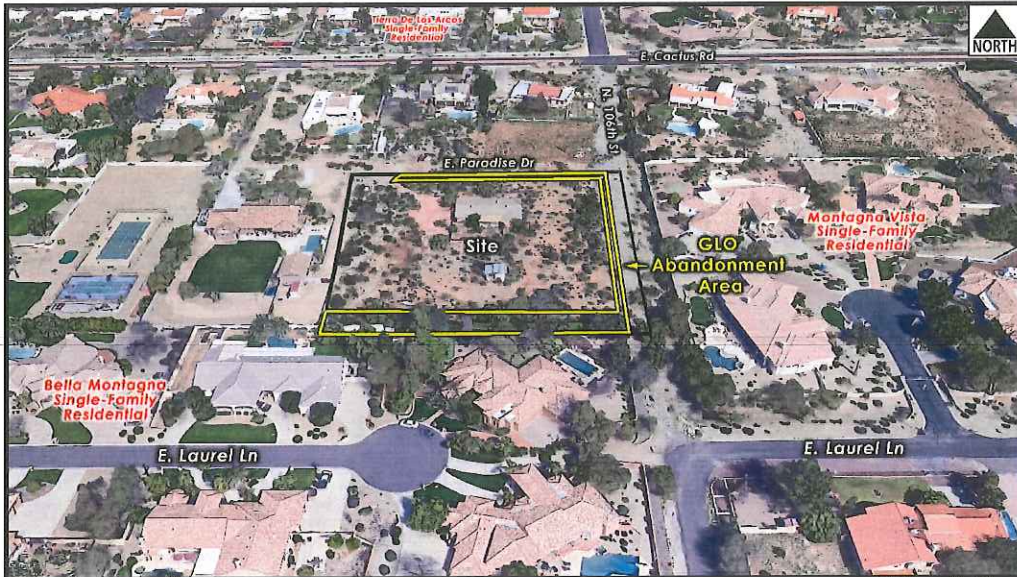

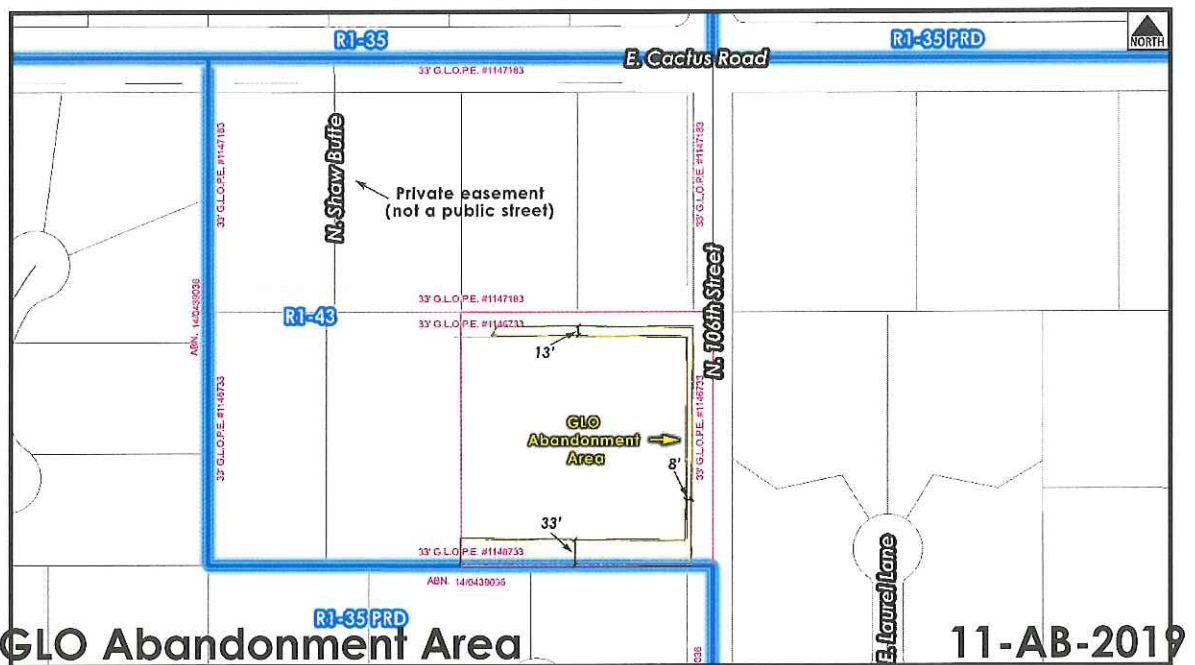

- Neighborhood support and opposition to new street alignment, East Paradise Drive
- East Paradise Drive provides legal access and street frontage for western neighbor
- Utility companies have no conflict or services within abandonment area

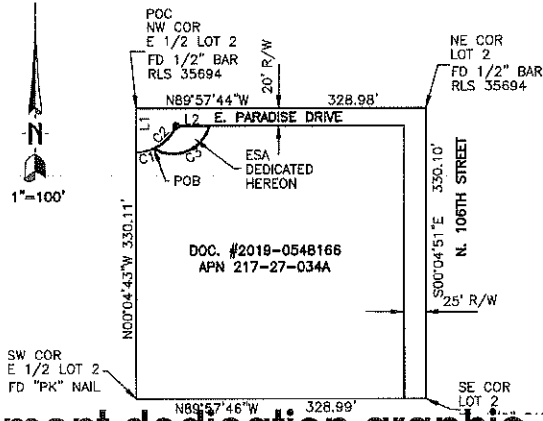

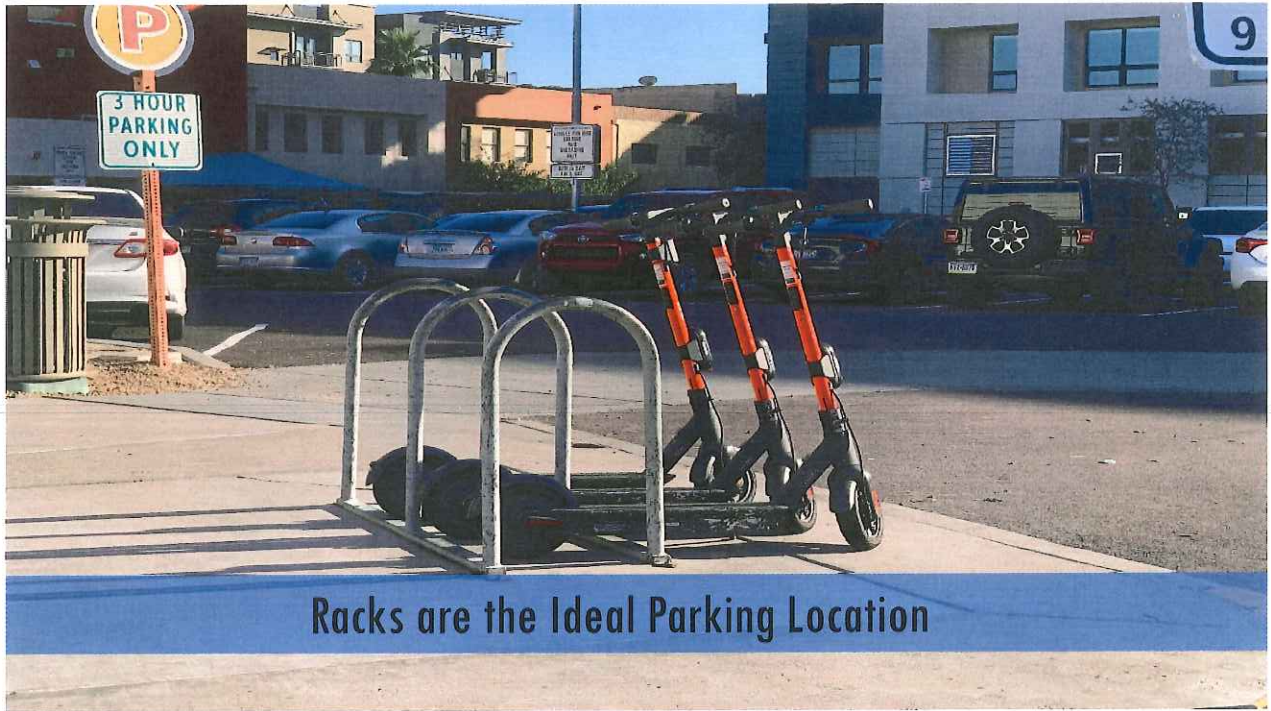

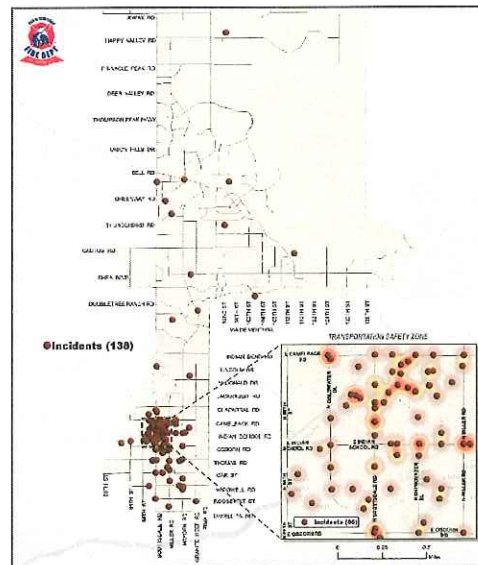
