Development Review Board

 On December 20, 2018, the Development Review Board heard Case 58-DR-2018 for the Maverick Mural and voted to approve Case 58-DR-2018 by a vote of 6-1. The mural location is along the north side of the building which places it on the property line, and it will face towards an existing parking lot on the adjacent property to the north.

DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL

Goal/Purpose of Request

The applicant is requesting approval of a large painted mural, titled 'The Maverick Mural,' featuring the image of Senator John McCain and the State of Arizona Flag, measuring 30 feet tall by 141 feet long, located on the north façade and property line of an existing two-story commercial building in Old Town Scottsdale. The proposed mural consists of approximately 30,000 pictograms (Attachment #6) representing the 5 Cs of Arizona: Copper, Cattle, Cotton, Citrus, and Climate. The pictograms are painted blue and red, on a white background, and arranged in a way to create an image of Senator McCain and the State of Arizona Flag when viewed from a distance. No lighting is proposed to illuminate the mural.

Neighborhood Communication

On December 11, 2018 and January 31, 2019 City Staff mailed postcard notifications to property owners within 750 feet of the site. As part of the applicant's neighborhood notification outreach requirement, the applicant mailed a letter to property owners within 750 feet of the site. The applicant's Project Notification Summary is attached to this report.

As of the date of this report, City Staff has received multiple emails and letters in support of the project, and multiple emails and letters opposing the project (Attachment #11). City Staff has received phone calls from the adjacent property owner of the parking lot north of the site, stating concerns of the project, how the building wall will be accessed to paint and maintain the mural, and possible trespassing onto the parking lot by pedestrians to view the mural. The adjacent property owner has also met with City Staff voicing opposition and concerns with the proposed mural.

DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD CRITERIA ANALYSIS

'The Maverick Mural' is proposed to be painted along the north façade of an existing commercial building, located at 4235 North Marshall Way. The mural location is along the north side of the building which places it on the property line, and it will face towards an existing parking lot on the adjacent property to the north. The project site is within the Marshall Way — Craftsman's Court Design District which is a component of the Downtown Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines. In addition, the proposed mural is to be guided by the Development Review Board criteria in accordance with Zoning Ordinance Section 1.904.

The location of the mural on the north side of the building abutting the property line poses a challenge for accessibility. The installation and maintenance of the mural requires crossing onto the parking lot of the adjacent property and its associated airspace. Without the permission from the owner of the adjacent property, physical trespass onto the parking lot to access the mural for installation and maintenance is a concern. In addition, the mural may possibly attract tourists and onlookers who may seek to cross onto the adjacent property to view the mural up close. However, due to the size, the mural can be easily viewed from a distance without the need to access the adjacent property.

<u>Downtown Urban Design & Architectural Design Guidelines</u>

Marshall Way - Craftsman's Court Urban Design Objectives

- 1. Promote Marshall Way's identity as an arts and gallery district.
 - Public art and sculpture are encouraged along building fronts, in courtyards and at other visible areas of new projects.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural addresses the Marshall Way – Craftsman's Court Urban Design Objectives by promoting a mural that promotes Marshall Way's identity as an arts and gallery district, and clearly visible from the adjacent street frontages along North Marshall Way and along East Fifth Avenue.

- 2. Strengthen the role of Marshall Way as an important pedestrian link between West Main and Fifth Avenue.
 - Maintain fine-grain building character, active street frontages and continuous pedestrian interest.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural is situated on the north side of the building located at 4235 North Marshall Way, and because of its scale and prominence viewed from a distance, it is visible from the intersection of East 5th Avenue and North Marshall Way. The prominent visibility from the street and sidewalk promotes the display of art for pedestrians traveling within the district.

Marshall Way - Craftsman's Court Design Guidelines

Desirable Architecture and Landscape Characteristics
 Colors: Light earth tones. Vivid colors may be used as accents in small areas.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural utilizes three colors: white, blue, and red. The base color is an off-white, specifically Dunn Edwards 'Historic White' DET653, which is the primary color of the entire building, approved under Case# 339-SA-2016#2. The blue color is Azule Europa 'RV-152,' while the red color is Rojo Madrid 'RV-241' (Attachment #7). The vivid blue and red colors are not light earth tones that reflect the Sonoran Desert color palette. Also, the scale of the mural encompasses the entire façade of the north elevation of the existing building, which diverts from the pedestrian experience encouraged within the district.

The Development Review Board shall determine whether the use of the vivid blue and red colors is appropriate within the context of the Marshall Way – Craftsman's Court Design Guidelines. In addition, the Development Review Board shall determine whether the scale of the proposed mural enhances the pedestrian experience or detracts from it.

Zoning Ordinance Section 1.904 – Development Review Board Criteria

The Board shall examine the design and theme of the application for consistency with the design and character components of the applicable guidelines, development standards, Design Standards and Policies Manual, master plans, character plan and General Plan.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural, as a private art piece, addresses the Old Town Scottsdale Character Area Plan, Chapter 4 – Arts & Culture, by creating a new art piece that supports the goals and policies of the chapter. The project addresses the following policies:

- Policy AC 1.1: Support a diverse range of arts and culture experiences downtown.
- Policy AC 1.4: Continue to invest in, improve, celebrate, and promote the Scottsdale Arts District, Scottsdale Civic Center, and the Arizona Canal as prominent downtown arts and culture destinations.
- Policy AC 2.2: Serve diverse community interests by supporting a variety of monumental art pieces, emerging artists, and temporary event-based programs downtown.
- Policy AC 3.1: Animate existing private and public spaces with art and culture, and create
 informal, spontaneous exhibition and performance spaces throughout the downtown.

The architectural character, landscaping and site design of the proposed development shall recognize the unique climatic and other environmental factors of this region to respond to the Sonoran Desert environment, as specified in the Sensitive Design Principles.

Sensitive Design Principle #9

The design of the built environment should respond to the desert environment:

- Materials with colors and coarse textures associated with the Sonoran Desert should be utilized.
- A variety of textures and natural materials should be used to provide visual interest and richness, particularly at the pedestrian level. Materials should be used honestly and reflect their inherent qualities.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural encompasses three colors: white, blue, and red. The base color is Dunn Edwards 'Historic White' DET653, is an off-white neutral color. The blue color is Azule Europa 'RV-152,' and the red color is Rojo Madrid 'RV-241.' The blue and red are more vivid and do not reflect a desert color palette or muted earth tone, although blue and red are the colors found on the State of Arizona Flag. It is the purview of the Development Review Board to consider the use of the colors and decide whether the colors are appropriate within the context of the Sensitive Design Principle #9.

The proposed mural uses approximately 30,000 pictograms representing the 5 Cs of Arizona: Copper, Cattle, Cotton, Citrus, and Climate, to form an image of Senator John McCain and the State of Arizona Flag when viewed from a distance. The use of pictograms provides visual uniqueness to the mural by providing a visual interest at the pedestrian level when viewed at close range.

Within the Downtown Area, building and site design shall demonstrate conformance with the Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines, and incorporate urban and architectural design that address human scale and incorporate pedestrian-oriented environment at the street level.

Marshall Way - Craftsman's Court Urban Design Objectives

Promote Marshall Way's identity as an arts and gallery district

 Public art and sculptures are encouraged along building fronts, in courtyards and at other visible areas of new projects.

Staff Analysis:

The proposed mural conforms to the Downtown Urban Design and Architectural Guidelines by addressing the applicable objectives outlined in the Marshall Way – Craftsman's Court Urban Design Objectives. The objectives promote the identity of the district as an arts and gallery district. The large scale of the proposed mural strengthens the identity of the district and its surrounding by promoting a piece of art that is highly visible to pedestrians within the district. However, the mural is located on the side of the building and not along the front, as the objective recommends. Its location along the side of the building is still very visible from the surrounding area. Although the scale of the mural is large when viewed from a distance, at close range, the mural incorporates unique pedestrian-oriented features with the incorporation of small pictograms representing Copper, Cattle, Cotton, Citrus, and Climate. The use of the pictograms provides a human-scale quality at the street level for such a large mural.





Project Narrative

Aaron Bass, Chen + Suchart Studio, and Eric Marvin, are excited to bring you "The Maverick." The Maverick is a commemorative mural located in the heart of "Old Town" Scottsdale, and will be dedicated to the late Senator John McCain, his family, and the public service men and women of our country. Together we are architects, developers, and artists. In practice, we use computational design and digital fabrication to bring projects to life.

The Maverick pulls from the halftone printing process, used to print newspapers since the 1800's. The halftone process uses a grid of dots varying in size to produce an overall image. Using computational tools from the architecture field, the Maverick places a digital spin on the halftone process. Instead of using different sized dots, we digitally arranged roughly 30,000 pictograms with varying color densities in a specific organization to create the overall image of Senator McCain with the Arizona flag in the background. Each pictogram stands 3 inches tall and represents Arizona's "five Cs": cattle, copper, citrus, climate, and cotton. The computational design tools not only help design the art but create the blueprint for installation and fabrication.

The art lies in the fabrication and organization before any paint is applied to the building. The mural starts in the computer with a custom designed computer program to create a series of stencils that are numerically organized and digitally cut to fit the building. The elevation of the building is then divided into a grid of 179 stencils applied by hand and used to guide the painting process. At this point, the project is simplified from a complex mathematical problem to a sophisticated paint by numbers installation. Because of overwhelming community support and national media attention, we were able to raise \$20,220 through a crowd-funding campaign from 157 financial backers who believe in this project and hope to bring the Maverick to the heart of Scottsdale.

The Maverick mural will be located on the North elevation of the 4235 N. Marshall Way building, adjacent to a surface parking lot, and across the street from the Bob Parks Horse Fountain. Its dimensions are: 30 feet tall by 141 feet long, totaling roughly 4,001 square feet. Our building is not only an exceptional canvas for this project, but it is located within the most appropriate site in Scottsdale, based on the objectives and design criteria of Scottsdale's own Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines.

The Downtown Plan identifies the building to be within the Marshall Way - Craftsman's Court District, also known as the "Old Town" arts and gallery district. The first Urban Design Objective within the Downtown Plan encourages art and sculpture along building fronts, courtyards, and at other visible areas. (Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines, Section D, Urban Design Objectives 1.) The Maverick mural is situated on the North elevation to promote visibility of art from the intersection of Marshall Way and 5th Ave.

The Guidelines also aim to strengthen the role of Marshall Way as an important pedestrian link between West Main and 5th Ave. (Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines, Section D, Urban Design Objectives 2). The Maverick furthers that goal by drawing pedestrian activity along 5th Ave and Marshall Way because of its scale and visibility. The Maverick's halftone design becomes clearer the farther away you stand, making the area adjacent to the roundabout at 5h Ave and Marshall Way the best location to view and photograph the mural. The Maverick also reinforces the identity of the arts district as a unique visual marker and conversation piece. It becomes a memory and landmark for trolley passengers and pedestrians alike. The project encourages people to come experience this district for its art.

Further, the Maverick's colors meet the Architecture and Landscape Characteristics Guidelines. The Maverick is made up of three colors: white, blue, and red. The base color will be the currently approved Navajo White that exists today. The Navajo White will make up over 60% of the building elevation color after the blue (MTN94 Azule Eruopa) and red (MTN94 Rojo Madrid) are added. All the paint is low velocity, UV resistant, and made for outdoor sun exposure. We believe the selected red and blue fall within desert colors (that staff consistently approves), but respect that the Design Review Board may categorize them as pastels, which fall within the conditionally acceptable colors for the area. City staff typically can approve these colors over the counter if the colors fall within the Architecture and Landscape Characteristics section of the Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines.

We look forward to the opportunity to create a piece of art that's engaging for all of Scottsdale, while commemorating an Arizona icon and public service. If you would like additional information please go to www.themaverickmural.com



ROOF PLAN/SITE PLAN 1








EXISTING CONDITION SITE PHOTO MAP







Hi, my name is Aaron Bass and in collaboration with Chen + Suchart Studio, and Eric Marvin, we are excited to bring you "The Maverick". The Maverick is a commemorative mural located in the heart of "Old Town" Scottsdale, and will be dedicated to the late Senator John McCain and his family. Together we are architects, developers, and artists. In practice, we use computational design and digital febrication to bring projects to life. We are raising a minimum of \$20,000 dollars through a Kickstarter Campaign which we will definitely meet our goal. We have been working for the past 8 menths to bring this project to the area as gift of public art. Thanks for supporting the Maverick. (See attachment of renderings + site map).

The Maverick mural will be located in the heart of "Old Tevro" Scottsdale on the north elevation of the 4235 N. Marshall Way building, adjacent to a surface parking lot, and across the street from the Bob Parks Horse Fountain. Its dimensions are: 30 feet tall by 141 feet loop, totaling roughly 4,001 square feet.

The mural pulls from the halftone printing process, used to print newspapers since the 1800's. The halftone process uses a grid of dots varying in size to produce an overall image. Using computational tools from the architecture field, the Maverick places a digital spin on the halftone process. Instead of using different sized dots, we digitally arranged roughly 30,000 pictograms with varying color densities in a specific organization to create the overall image of Senator McCain with the State's flag in the background. Each pictogram stands 3 inches tall and represents Arizona's "five Cs"; cattle, copper, citrus, climate, & cotton. The computational design tools not only help design the art but create the bluescint for installation and fabrication.

The art lies in the fabrication and organization before any paint is applied to the building. The mural starts in the computer with a custom written computer program to create with a series of digitally stencils that numerically organized and digitally cut to fit the building. The building is then divided into a grid of 179 stencils applied by hand and used to guide the painting process. At that point the project has reduced from a complex mathematical problem to a sophisticated paint by numbers installation.




Site plan - Location map



I am the owner of the parcel at 4247 N. Marshall Way, which is 60 feet North of the property line of the North elevation of the building on which the huge mural is proposed. I am a front line property owner separated only by the 60 feet width of the parking lot to south which adjoins the North elevation of the building. My view of the project is direct and unobstructed, and it will be visible the entire 150 feet length of my lot.

I am unalterably opposed to this project. The sheer magnitude of the proposed mural is just incredible. It is 140 feet Long and is 4 stories High! By any comprehensible definition, this should be considered a public art project and be subject to review and scrutiny. The fact that the mural's proposed location is on the side of a private building which overlooks a parking lot and a back alley in Downtown Scottsdale does not change the fundamental nature and character of this project.

In the discussions I have had with other property and business owners concerning the proposed mural, there is considerable opposition to the project once the public understands the enormity of its size as well as the subject matter. The fact that all of the presumed support for the project is the result of the publicity generated by the building owner and the artists who have a direct financial interest in the mural should be considered by your staff and by DR the Board if there is to be an objective review of this project which takes into account the interest of all Scottsdale residents and not just the few who will profit by its presence.

I hope there will be full consideration of this project reviewing the points I have raised as well as other comments from members of the public. The DR Board meeting is scheduled for December 20, 8 days after notice was posted and on the day before the start of the holiday travel season. Such expedited scheduling is hardly transparent, and the timing effectively impedes public participation in this process all to the benefit of the applicants and to the detriment of the public.

I request that my comments, as set forth in this letter, be presented to the DR Board inasmuch as it is representative of the views of other property owners and business owners in the area who will not have the opportunity to attend the meeting on December 20.

Dear Randy:

I have just learned that the above-referenced DR Case, requesting approval for a large mural on the north elevation of the building located at 4235 N. Marshall Way, has been scheduled for a hearing before the Board on Thursday, December 20.

The report recommends staff approval of the project. The staff initially placed the matter on the Board's Consent Agenda so that the matter would be confirmed by a simple voice vote without any discussion. I understand that the matter has been moved to the Regular Agenda, but your staff continues to push for quick approval by the DR Board before the holiday season begins on Friday.

This extraordinary rush procedure is being pursued notwithstanding that the minimum 30-days notice for a DR Board was not given. Additionally, many of the property owners in direct proximity to the project, all well within the 750 feet distance requirement, have not received any notice by mail of the December 20 hearing. Most of the directly-impacted property owners learned of the hearing by chance when they saw the small sign posted by your department on December 12, a mere eight days before the hearing.

I am expressing my opposition to this project in the strongest possible terms. The idea that a project of this size --- 140 feet by 30 feet --- could be thought to be appropriate in this location is simply astounding. The magnitude of this project is comparable to placing a block-long billboard, three stories tall, in the midst of downtown.

The proposed mural can only be directly seen in its entirety (i.e. the full length and height) from three directions: — the North from three parcels which are parking lots; the West side of Marshall Way, a multi-use retail building; and the East with the back entrances to buildings facing an alley. The owners of all properties to the North and West which have a direct and unobstructed view of the project are all opposed. The letter you have received from John Rao who owns the middle parcel to the North of the project expresses the position of those owners including the owner of the property owner on the West side of Marshall Way.

I have lived in Scottsdale since 1953. I have served my community in a variety of capacities over the last 40 years. I do not recall that a project has ever been processed in such an expedited manner and without full notice as the Planning and Development Department is proceeding in this case. It is analogous to a runaway freight train.

You surely are mindful of the fact that the project has been controversial in the community not only because of its size but also because of how the project originated with the commercial exploitation of Senator McCain's image, persona, and legacy. It is difficult to understand why the City staff and your department seems compelled to fast-track the entire process by disregarding posting timelines, adequate notification to adjoining property owners, and scheduling the hearing on a date before the start of a holiday. It effectively ensures that there will be little or no public input from anyone other than the proponents.

It is my hope that you will provide a full explanation as to why this case is being handled in what can only be described as highly unusual manner.





NO DRASTIC CHANGE EFFECTED
