
Downtown Scottsdale :: Distinctive Districts

Downtown Scottsdale is comprised of 725 acres & a number of distinctive districts:



Downtown Vision Principles

- Preserve character & scale of existing specialty districts
- Locate major economic drivers outside specialty districts
- Emphasize unique regulations & guidelines for downtown districts
- Revitalize downtown using strategic infrastructure investment, financial & small business assistance, revised regulations & ordinances
- Take a more direct role in the provision & management of downtown parking, circulation & signage



Old Town District

• Old Town embodies Scottsdale's historical legacy as the "West's Most Western Town". Old west architectural character, Western goods, Native American crafts & Southwestern artifacts all contribute to this district's attractive frontier town charm, making it a major tourist draw.





Main Street :: Arts District

• The Main Street-Arts District is an eclectic mix of contemporary and southwestern art galleries, residential, retail, and museum elements that will carry Scottsdale's artist origins into downtown's visionary future.



5th Avenue :: Marshall Way District

• Contemporary galleries, specialty retail, upscale dining, active nightlife, and downtown living opportunities characterize this area. The 5th Avenue-Marshall Way District will undergo major small scale revitalization efforts in the near future due to its adjacency to the planned Arizona Canal at Scottsdale project.



Entertainment District

• Comprised of creative, contemporary architectural design, active entertainment venues, trend setting retail, small office facilities, and urban residential spaces; the Entertainment District attracts an eclectic mix of entrepreneurs, residents, and visitors to this downtown neighborhood.



Fashion Square :: Waterfront District

• This district encompasses large scale regional shopping, and employment centers with upscale metropolitan housing. This district is a major economic driver for the city, and attracts visitors and residents to Downtown Scottsdale for its national tenant shopping, entertainment & dining.


