Vista Del Camino Social Services

The Community Assistance Office/Vista Del Camino has volunteer opportunities in the Vista One Stop Career Center. Volunteers are needed to greet visitors, orient them to the career center, and provide basic resume writing, job search, and career counseling services. The Center is currently open 8a – 5p Monday – Friday. We use volunteers on a year round basis for the clothing bank and for the food bank. The food bank, because of space, uses only one major helper here (at the location where the food is stored we have two gentlemen who help on a regular basis). At the clothing bank we use volunteers two mornings a week, two hours each day, and also can use them for distribution, cleaning, sorting during the Back to School Clothing drive and program. We haven't set dates yet for that, but it is usually the middle of August.
