OUR HISTORY

In July 1993, the City of Scottsdale purchased the Paiute Elementary School campus to serve as the city's first Neighborhood Enhancement Center. Citizens in the neighborhood were surveyed so that a determination could be made about what services the neighbors needed and wanted in a community center. The results of that survey gave direction to the planning of the campus. The computer center, teen center, multi-purpose room, health clinic, classrooms and Head Start program are a direct result of neighborhood input. Phase 1 opened in 1995 and included the administration, multipurpose and classroom buildings. 1996's Phase 2 renovations featured the teen center, additional classrooms and a health center. Phase 3 included the opening of the Early Childhood Learning Center and Handlebar Helpers. Phase 4 opened in Fall 2003 and features the Paiute Active Adult Senior Center, new Family Meeting and Performance Center and Scottsdale Community College classrooms.
