

As an extractionist, I built forensic and clinical worklists from the specimen queue and prepared the proper chain-of-custody documentation for urine drug testing. Each assay was aliquoted with a reagent blank, quality controls and specimen, which were diluted based on immunoassay results. Each day, I conducted multiple solid-phase and liquid/liquid extractions simultaneously. I navigated ChemStation software in order to analyze data and generate results. I performed the first technical review of the results and then submitted the analytical documentation for a final review.
