We kicked off the year with attendance at the League of Arizona Cities and Towns event in the fall where students were exposed to various keynote speakers who engaged students on topics such as mental health, leadership, and networking skills. This was an incredibly rewarding experience where students met other like-minded individuals from different cities and

towns In Arizona.



As the school year began the SMYC team as a group decided to focus on sustainability, as it relates to the social, environmental, and economic pillars. Students met regularly in their respective groups to discuss how they could impact their community in each of these efforts. These group discussions led to presentations and tours associated with animal welfare, water conservation, and budgeting within the city. In addition to gaining awareness and education on these topics, they were active in their community by attending various events such as an adopt -a-road clean up, volunteering at various holiday functions, and assisting with the City of Scottsdale's Veteran's Day event. After an engaging conversation and networking opportunity students were met with a thought-provoking presentation by Dr. Scott Cloutier, Arizona State Assistant Professor in the School of Sustainability, and the Director of the Happy Lab. Dr. Cloutier engaged students in discussion related to the intersection of sustainability and happiness and how the two converge or diverge. He shared insights on sustainability and it's relationship to happiness. He challenged students to look and reflect on their own lives, their activities, and the impact of these choices may have on their daily lives. The evening ended with students completing a satisfaction survey that provided feedback to the council that will assist them in the future.
