Christie Lee Kinchen spoke in opposition to bullying. Paula Sturgeon Mortensen spoke in support of the Council's authority to lead the City. Michael O'Quinn expressed concern about alternative service for photo radar enforcement actions. Jason Alexander asked the Council to take a stand against anonymous emails and anonymous campaigns.
