Mayor's Report – Mayor Ortega welcomed everyone to Western Week when Old Town is transformed into an authentic old west experience for the whole family. Several events are scheduled that include family-friendly games, food, music, and entertainment.

- > On Thursday, February 3, 2022, is the Gold Palette ArtWalk in the Scottsdale Arts District from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- > On Friday, February 4, 2022, the 64th Annual Hashknife Pony Express will arrive between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., at the Scottsdale Museum of the West.
- ➤ On Saturday, February 5, 2022, the 68th Annual Parada Del Sol Historic Parade along Scottsdale Road will take place between 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This will be followed by the Trail's End Festival held in the Historic Old Town District from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- ➤ On Saturday, February 5, 2022, the Arizona Indian Festival will be in Old Town from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Sunday, February 6, 2022, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Festivities will include the native edible experience at Scottsdale's Museum of the West on Saturday, February 5, 2022, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
