Pledge of Allegiance – Councilwoman Whitehead

Mayor's Report – Mayor Ortega asked for a moment of silence to pray for the safety and peace for the Ukrainian people. Mayor Ortega recognized the passing of two notable members of the Scottsdale community. Joseph Coatsworth was the Chairman of the Board for the Neighborhood Outreach for Access to Healthcare (NOAH) and previously served as the Chief Executive Officer of the Arizona Association of Community Health Centers. Darlene Petersen was a retired nurse who was a frequent visitor to City Hall to express her opinion and knew the beauty of Scottsdale. Ms. Petersen was a past president of the Scottsdale Historical Society and was responsible for many of the actions they supported to create historic buildings in Scottsdale. Mayor Ortega noted that the McDowell Sonoran Preserve's Fraesfield and Granite Mountain trailheads were awarded with two environmental excellence Crescordia awards from Arizona Forward. Mayor Ortega reminded everyone that next week is National Library Week. He invited everyone to celebrate and participate in the bookmark design contest. - Water Resources Executive Director Brian Biesemeyer gave the presentation. Arizona Public Service (APS) Greater Phoenix Area Key Account Manager Patricia McLaughlin and CPower Energy Management Account Executive Matt Pool presented the City with an APS Peak Solutions rebate check in the amount of \$137,926.80.

- Provide a deck park to retain some of the parking.
- Install a surface that is soft and absorbent and lends itself for other uses, such as a Farmer's Market or other events.
- Not compromise parking spaces for open space.
- Plant desert landscaping that is drought resistant and uses the least amount of water.
- Install drip systems and/or other devices that will funnel and recycle the water used for the landscaping.
- Install air pumps for bicycle use.
- Include rest areas.
- Install signage for directions to parking, bicycle and bicycle racks, and pedestrian paths to access businesses and services.
- Ensure sidewalks and walkways have a level, non-slip surface.
- Install art features, such as murals, sculpture garden, or decorative ramadas.
- Determine if there is accessibility to accommodate food trucks in the area.
- Explore options to use one-time money from development proposals approved in the downtown area to fund expansion of a park.
- Add 30 feet to the Canal area to project a deck over the canal that would provide covered parking, resulting in a usable, inviting canal side deck park.

- Dig Studios Associate Principal Brandon Sobiech gave the PowerPoint presentation.

- Councilmembers made the following suggestions:
  - Extend shading elements to expand corners and connectivity to Scottsdale Road and Main Street allowing for access to businesses.
  - Expand the eight-foot bike path or covered walkways into a continuous loop from 2<sup>nd</sup> Street to Scottsdale Road to Main Street and returning to the Civic Center Plaza.
  - Encourage parties to work together to expand treescapes from Civic Center Plaza onto 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
  - Encourage the bulk of vehicular traffic to use the split at the couplet located at Scottsdale Road and Civic Center Drive to remain on Scottsdale Road to alleviate traffic congestion at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
  - Narrow the width of the bicycle lanes or have bicycles flow onto the road along 2<sup>nd</sup> Street to retain parking spaces.
  - Staff to provide information and a map related to the location of existing and proposed parking spaces.
  - Retain the texture, feel, and look of Old Town Scottsdale in the plans.
  - Do not eliminate parking spaces as agreed to in the Museum of the West contract.
  - Upgrade the street pavement.
  - Install large, easy-to-read signage and lighting in the area.
  - Install improved wayfinding signage to make it more eye catching and directional.
  - Implement improvements discussed in the presentation to make 2<sup>nd</sup> Street a destination area that will attract more visitors.
  - Beautify the area around the Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art to make it more user-friendly and engaging.
  - Increase awareness related to available parking and amenities on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.
  - Develop strategic areas with more parking spots and eliminate small parking lots and develop them into parks or retail space.
  - Focus on the use of space that is judicious and beneficial.
  - Locate ride share drop off sites at convenient locations on every block or every other block to eliminate congestion.
  - Conduct public outreach related to this proposal.
