Mayor's Report

Mayor Ortega asked to keep the Ukrainian people and country in the forefront of our thoughts and for a moment of silence as we hope for their freedom and their fight for democracy.

Mayor Ortega announced that it is National Public Works Week and acknowledged the City has many projects under construction that were authorized by bonds and citizen input. Mayor Ortega added that it was Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Week and National Police Week. He took the opportunity to thank all police officers, EMS providers, and public works employees for their contributions to Scottsdale.

Mayor Ortega reported that the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Gold Championships will take place at Grayhawk Golf Club, with the women's tournament held May 20th through May 25th and the men's tournament taking place May 27th through June 1st. He noted that all the regional championships have been played and the players will be coming to Scottsdale for the final NCAA championships.

Mayor Ortega announced that Scottsdale Stadium will be hosting the Pac-12 Conference Baseball Championship from May 25th through May 29th. It is a great opportunity to see the best of college play in baseball and tickets are now available.

Public Comment - None

1. Citizens Committee to Continue 0.2% Sales Tax

- City Treasurer Sonia Andrews gave a PowerPoint presentation.
- Regarding the structure of the citizen group, there was Council consensus for an Advisory Task Force as follows:
 - It will be formed by Council resolution.
 - There will be a formal application process following the method used with other boards and commissions.
 - It will be comprised of Scottsdale residents.

- There will be 9 members representing different geographical areas (North, Central and South) of the City using the geographical map created for the council districting process discussion.
- The members will be appointed by the Council.
- The Task Force will follow the Open Meeting Law.
- The Task Force will directly advise the Council.
- Councilmembers made the following suggestions regarding the structure of the Advisory Task Force:
 - Include staff members who:
 - 1) have knowledge of the Preserve, including the history and anticipated ongoing maintenance needs and costs:
 - 2) provide legal advice; and
 - 3) provide financial analysis and costing information.
 - Selection of task force members will be based on qualifications as listed in the application, including experience with parks and recreation, tourism, and the McDowell Sonoran Preserve and Conservancy.
- Regarding the objectives of the Advisory Task Force, there was Council consensus to:
 - Identify needs related to ongoing preservation, perpetual maintenance, protection, conservation, sustainability and education for the McDowell Sonoran Preserve, greenbelts, and other open space.
 - Delete the bullet "Other city needs".
 - Engage in surveys, public education, and outreach.
- Councilmembers made the following suggestions for the objectives of the Task Force:
 - Include future public safety costs, [fire and police costs] and other costs that may be associated with protection of the Preserve, parks and recreation, and open spaces [invasive species] or determine if these needs would fall under the preservation, maintenance, and protection objectives that the Council reached consensus on.
 - Objectives need to be related to parks and preserves goals.
 - Have the Task Force consider using the remaining bond funds towards the operation and maintenance of the Preserve. This would require voter approval to switch the use of the bond funds from acquisition to preservation.
 - Use the remaining bond funds to acquire key parcels for the Preserve.
 - Have City staff and the Task Force determine the yearly operations and maintenance costs for the Preserve.
- Based on Council feedback, City staff will look at the timeline to determine if the Task Force application and appointment process can be moved up from the proposed October through December 2022 timeframe, noting that a resolution needs to be passed by the Council that forms the Task Force before the application process commences.
- Councilmembers and staff discussed the mission of the Task Force which would include, but not be limited to, consideration of the replacement of the existing 0.2% tax, exploration of financial matters including the use of the existing tax, and recommendations on what the Council should ask voters to authorize.
