
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
#### **Project Description:**


- On May 16th 2023, the Council approved the first of two Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) construction awards in the amount of \$9,250,058 for the procurement of long lead material and equipment necessary for the renovation of the Police Training Facility located at the Hontz facility
- The purpose of this action is to authorize the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP2) contract award for the remaining scope items including complete construction services to renovate and expand the Police Training Facility
- The existing facility was designed to support 215 Police Officers.
   Scottsdale now has 689 sworn and civilian personnel using the training facility and it does not have adequate space to accommodate required training.
- The current facility is over 20 years old, undersized, does not meet the national training curriculum standards and limits the type of training police officers and personnel can receive, creating a public safety concern.
