- 2. Diane D. Cusack and Billie Axline Gentry, having received more than the number of votes constituting a majority of all ballots cast, were elected as Councilmen for four-year terms to commence on March 23, 1982.
- 3. Dave Quintieri having received the next greatest number of votes cast in the Primary Election, which number was less than the majority of all ballots cast, was nominated as a candidate for the remaining single Office of Councilman for the General Election on March 23, 1982, and Jean L. Black having received the next greatest number of votes cast in the Primary Election was also nominated as a candidate for said Office of Councilman at said General Election.
- 4. Propositions 100, 102, 103 and 105 were approved and ratified by a majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and Propositions 101 and 104 were not approved by the electors voting thereon.
