Scottsdale Civic Center wins top award



Arizona Forward honored the Scottsdale Civic Center with a Crescordia, the highest honor given in each category of its Environmental Excellence Awards program.

In 2023, Scottsdale unveiled a comprehensive renovation of the area that has served as the city's civic and signature special event and gathering space for 55 years. The project was designed and built with sustainability in mind by adding planted bioswales to collect and capture stormwater, permeable pavements with underground water conveyance, targeted roof water collection to supply existing trees with an extra boost of water, reducing turf lawn and water features and incorporating new low water use plants.

Important information about Scottsdale's upcoming elections

With the candidate field set for Scottsdale's July 30 primary election, voters should take note of important deadlines. The voter registration deadline for the primary election is July 1. Early voting begins July 3. The last day to request an early ballot is July 19. Early ballots should be mailed back no later than July 23; however, you may vote early in person through July 26.

If you are registered as Independent or Party Not Declared, you must request a party or city-only ballot to participate in the July 30 primary election.

Nov. 5 General Election information

The City Council referred two items to the November ballot for Scottsdale voters to consider - a city proposal to replace and reduce an expiring sales tax, and an adjustment to the city's state-imposed spending limitation. The Scottsdale Fire Department is preparing to launch municipal ambulance service early next year



Why create a city ambulance service? Scottdale Fire Chief Tom Shannon emphasized the critical need for comprehensive "door-to-door" care, considering that more than 18,000 residents and visitors were transported to hospitals by third-party ambulance services last year alone.

The rollout will occur in phases. The first three ambulances staffed by trained City of Scottsdale firefighter paramedics and emergency medical technicians are being equipped now; the first patient transport is expected to occur in January 2025.

Subsequent phases are slated for implementation over the next 2-4 years.

Eventually, nine Scottsdale Fire Department ambulances will cover the entire service area. Over the phase-in period, Scottsdale will continue to rely on third-party ambulance services as needed.

Investing in Our Scottsdale: Railroad Park improvements are underway. Scottsdale is adding features to the much beloved McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park which will make it even more popular during the hot summer months, including an indoor train-themed play structure and splash pad. Construction will take approximately a year to complete.

The new Roundhouse building will focus on train-themed play, its centerpiece a huge play structure shaped like a locomotive. Other improvements include a splashpad play area and new restrooms, pathways, lighting and trees.

The indoor play structure is being purchased by the Scottsdale Railroad & Mechanical Society, the park's non-profit partner. The remainder of the project is funded by the city's general fund, park revenues and tourism funds. Learn more at ScottsdaleAZ.gov, search "railroad park improvements."
