MCDOWELL SONORAN PRESERVE MONTH

You're invited to a free celebration Oct. 18


October is McDowell Sonoran Preserve Month – a great time to explore the scenic wonders of Scottsdale's native mountain and desert regions.

To celebrate, Scottsdale is hosting a free community event Sunday, Oct. 18, at the Brown's Ranch Trailhead, 30301 N. Alma School Parkway. Join us for a variety of hikes and informative exhibits focused on the preserve.

Activities begin at 8 a.m. with guided hikes at three distances: 8 miles, 4 miles and the ½-mile Jane Rau Interpretive Trail. Other preserve programs and demonstrations are scheduled at 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. A complete schedule of events is available at www.mcdowellsonoran.org.

The preserve covers more than 30,000 acres in Scottsdale and features roughly 170 miles of non-motorized, multi-use trails. No matter your level of fitness or mobility, there is a trail to match your ability.

Access to the preserve is available at 11 maintained city trailheads. Find more information at ScottsdaleAZ.gov, search "preserve."

NOV. 3 SPECIAL ELECTION

Scottsdale voters will go to the polls Nov. 3 to consider a variety of bond-funded civic improvements totaling nearly \$100 million.

Dates to remember for the Nov. 3 Scottsdale Special Election:

- Oct. 5 is the last day to register to vote in the election
- Oct. 7 is when early ballots are mailed
- Oct. 23 is the last day to request to receive an early ballot in the mail
- Oct. 30 is the last day to cast an early ballot at an early voting site

Scottsdale's Nov. 3 Special Election asks voters to consider approval of bonds for a number of public projects in an amount not to exceed \$95,960,000. The estimated average annual tax rate for the proposed bond authorization is \$0.11 per \$100 of net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purposes.

ELECCIÓN ESPECIAL DEL 3 DE NOVIEMBRE

El 3 de noviembre los votantes de Scottsdale acudirán a las urnas para una variedad mejoramientos cívicos financiados con bonos sumando casi \$100 millones.

Fechas que recordar de la Elección Especial de Scottsdale del 3 de noviembre:

- El 5 de octubre es el último día para inscribirse para votar en al elección
- El 7 de octubre es cuando las boletas tempranas se enviarán por correo
- El 23 de octubre es el último día para pedir recibir una boleta temprana por correo
- El 30 de octubre es el último día para votar una boleta temprana en un sitio de votación temprana

La Elección Especial de Scottsdale del 3 de noviembre les pide a los votantes considerar aprobación de bonos para un número de proyectos públicos en una cantidad que no exceda \$95,960,000. El calculado promedio de la tasa de impuestos anual de la autorización propuesta de bonos es \$0.11 por \$100 de la valuación neta tasada que se usa para propósitos de impuestos secundarios sobre la propiedad.



EARN UP TO \$250 FOR REMOVING YOUR SALT-BASED WATER SOFTENER

Did you know Scottsdale recycles nearly 100 percent of our wastewater for future beneficial use, including groundwater recharge? It's an invaluable, renewable resource, but high levels of salinity in our recycled water – caused in large part by salt-using water softeners – can be harmful for people and the environment and are expensive to remove. You can help reduce the amount of salt in our wastewater by removing or upgrading your salt-based water softener, and, as part of a limited time pilot program, Scottsdale Water is offering rebates to help you do so.
