WATER LINE WORK WILL RESTRICT FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT TRAFFIC THIS SUMMER

Traffic will be restricted – at times down to one lane in both directions – on Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard starting this summer to permit installation of a new water line.

Scottsdale is in the middle of a multiyear project to install the line, which will improve service reliability and efficiency in the area.

The project was broken into two phases. Phase 1, completed last December, installed the new main under Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard from Via Linda to Shea Boulevard.

Phase 2 will extend the new main under Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard between Via Linda and 90th Street. This phase will last about one year.

Water line installation is a significant construction activity, but Scottsdale is committed to minimizing residential impacts and supporting local business operations. Scottsdale Water will be sending regular updates throughout the project. You are encouraged to sign up to receive project update emails.

WINTER HOME PROJECT? YOU MAY DESERVE A BREAK ON SEWER CHARGES

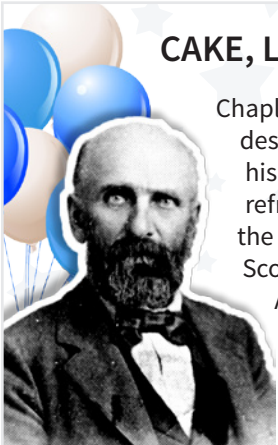
Did you plant a winter lawn or fix a leaky toilet recently? If so, you may be eligible for a sewer charge adjustment.

Sewer charges are associated with the costs to treat wastewater that is discharged from your home into the city's sanitary sewer system. Unlike water usage, however, sewer usage is not metered. Instead, sewer charges are based on a customer's average water use in the cooler winter months when outdoor watering and pool evaporation should be greatly reduced. This provides a better representation of the actual indoor wastewater amounts that are returned to the sewer system.

Sewer charges are recalculated annually in July based on your average water usage billed in December, January and February. If your water usage the past three months was not a true reflection of the actual water discharged to the city's sewer system, you may appeal your sewer charges by completing a sewer charge adjustment request.
