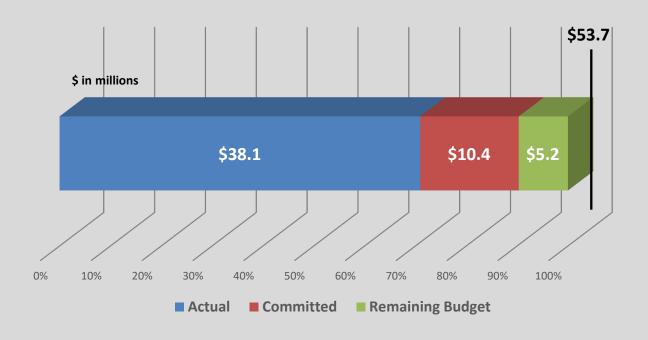

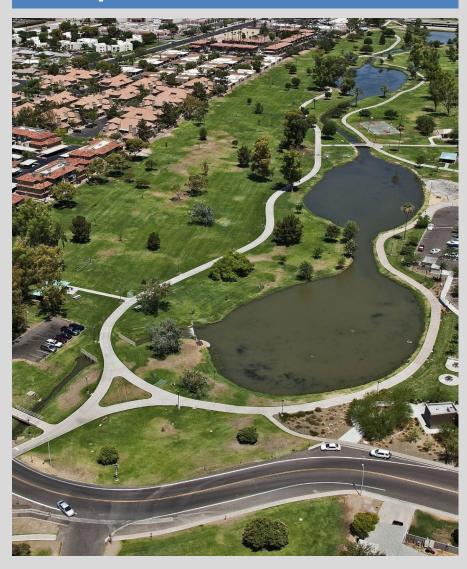

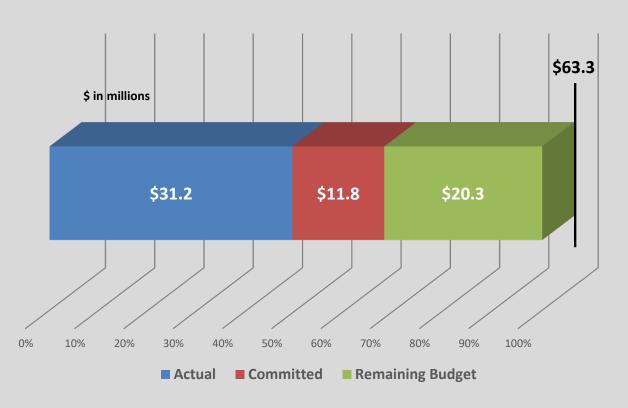


Community Spaces and Infrastructure 20 Projects - \$112.3 million

As of April 30, 2023

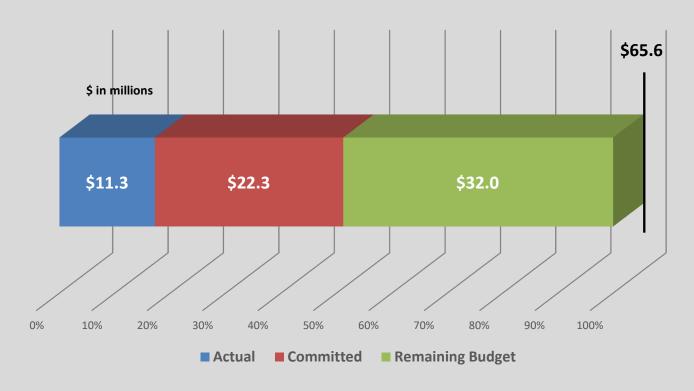


Public Safety and Technology 24 Projects - \$94.1 million

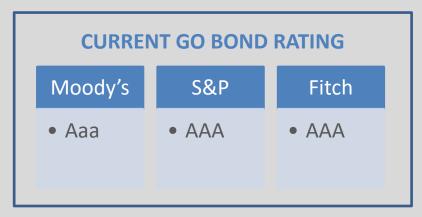
