#### CALL TO ORDER

Chair Eng called the meeting of the Scottsdale Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to order at 5:01 PM. and called for a roll call.

#### ROLL CALL

A formal roll call was conducted confirming member attendance as stated above.

#### HOUSEKEEPING UPDATES

Staff member Erin Walsh recognized Committee Member Joe DuBois. This is his first meeting as a member of the Committee.

Next, Ms. Walsh recognized that two members of the are on their last meeting. Committee members Neely and Armstrong have served two full terms with the Committee and she thanked them for their service.

Three seats are up for appointment by the Council. Committee Member Hur is at the end of his first term. All three seats will be filled in October.

In addition to the new faces on the dais, there are a few new members at the staff table. Legal Council Eric Anderson (substituting for Legal Council Kim Campbell who is on maternity leave). Also, Budget Director Judy Doyle has taken a new position with the City, but Keith Marquis from the Budget office may be with us full time.

Finance Director, Gina Kirkland is joining via Teams and will be presenting item number 7.

Next meeting will be November 30, 2023.

#### 1. Approval of the June 12, 2023, Summarized Minutes

Chair Eng opened the meeting by requesting if any members had questions for or corrections to the June 12, 2023, meeting minutes. Chair Eng asked a motion to approve the minutes as written.

Approved. Senior Budget Analyst, Keith Marquis presented the latest Bond 2019 financial report. Questions from the Committee were addressed by Mr. Marquis, Mr. Worth and Ms. Tymkiw.

Motion by Committee Member Neely to continue to move forward with a recommendation to Council. Due to lack of second, motion failed.

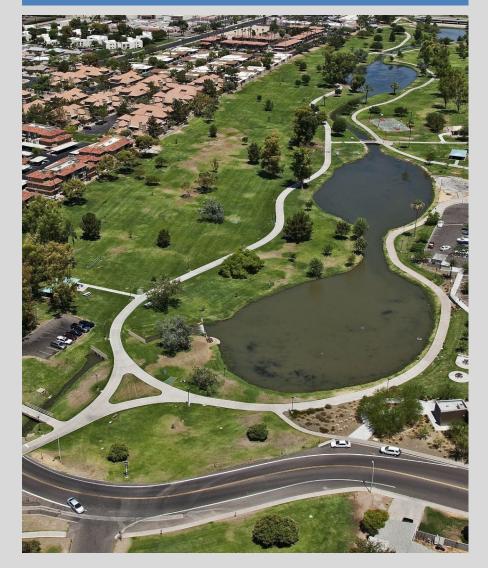

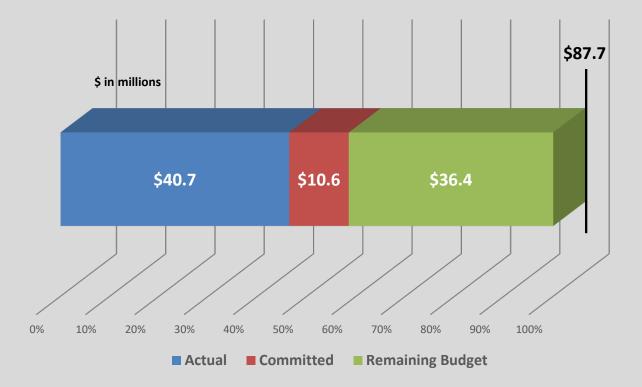


Community Spaces and Infrastructure 20 Projects - \$112.3 million

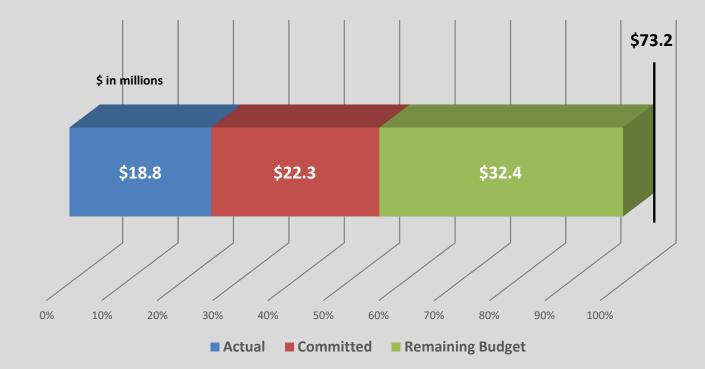

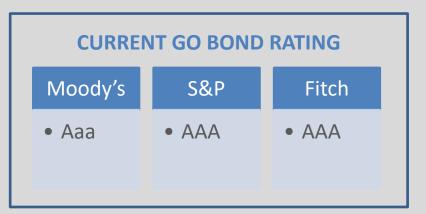
