## 2. Overview of Park Sites, Amenities, and Maintenance Needs within the Indian Bend Wash Greenbelt

- Information on the unfunded needs of the McDowell Sonoran Preserve Commission
- Discussion related to funding operations of the parks and McDowell Sonoran Preserve
- Presentation from Public Safety on the activities and concerns of police and park rangers within the parks and the McDowell Sonoran Preserve
- Brainstorming session on areas and topics to survey community opinions
