BOARD MEMBER LURIE MOVED TO APPROVE THE JANUARY 11, 2024, SCOTTSDALE HOUSING AGENCY GOVERNING BOARD MEETING MINUTES. VICE-CHAIR JUNG SECONDED THE MOTION, WHICH CARRIED SEVEN (7) TO ZERO (0) BY ROLL CALL VOTE. CHAIR SHEARER, VICE-CHAIR JUNG, AND COMMISSIONERS SERLIN, LURIE,

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DODDS, TURGEL, AND BROWNELL VOTED IN THE AFFIRMATIVE. COMMISSIONER JAMESON WAS NOT PRESENT. THERE WERE NO DISSENTING VOTES.

## 2. <u>Public Hearing FY 2024/2025 PHA Streamlined Annual Plan and Administrative</u> Plan Revisions

Mary Witkofski, Community Assistance Manager, presented the FY 2024/2025 PHA Streamlined Annual Agency Plan, highlighting accomplishments of the Housing Agency to date this fiscal year. Christina Cooley, HCV Supervisor, presented the FY 2023/2024 Administrative Plan Revisions for the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program, noting that many changes are through the Housing Opportunities to Modernization Act (HOTMA), which must be implemented no later than January 1, 2025. She opened the floor for public comments.

There were no comments or questions from the public.

Commissioners were given an opportunity to ask questions. Ms. Cooley said that she does not have the exact number of participants that would be affected by the new regulation terminating participants for assets over \$100,000. She estimated that approximately five to ten participants might fall into that category.

Chair Shearer closed the public hearing.
