- City Treasurer Sonia Andrews and Public Works Director Dan Worth gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Quarterly Financial and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) updates.
- Councilmembers made the following observations and suggestions:
  - There was a positive variance in retail and dining due to continued strong consumer spending.
  - The Via Linda Police Station is 35 years old as it opened in 1989 and now the loft space in the building is being utilized to create more space for police dispatch.
  - The storage and injection wells for water are like an ATM as they store clean water and make it available for future withdrawals as needed.
  - Clean water is stored in the storage and injection wells which are the size of one square mile and 80 feet high. These aquifers preserve the underground caverns and are part of the City's infrastructure which provides sustainability for the water system.
  - The solar panel shade structures would provide additional shaded space in the Civic Center area.
  - The Miller Bridge is an essential part of the transportation network but there have been concerns from residents due to the time the crews are able to work on the construction.
  - The budget to actual and funding source reporting is understandable and was requested for all projects.
  - The payback period for solar is generally 15 to 20 years but there are other benefits as well.
