Mayor's Report

– Mayor Ortega called attention to the ongoing wars in foreign countries as they fight to protect their democracy and freedom and asked for a moment of silent reflection for these war-torn countries and for the safety of our military personnel.

– Mayor Ortega presented a Citation of Merit for all city personnel for their work during Scottsdale's high season of activities and events, which starts in November and continues into May.

– Mayor Ortega presented a proclamation declaring Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) Awareness Week in Scottsdale. The proclamation was presented to Scottsdale residents.

– Mayor Ortega noted that it was graduation week, noting it was a great time to celebrate and bring a close to Scottsdale's event season.

– Mayor Ortega thanked Vice Mayor Whitehead for her service as Vice Mayor and announced Councilmember Graham would be the next Vice Mayor starting in June.

City Manager's Report – Tourism and Events Director Karen Churchard gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Tourism and Events Strategic Plan. Mayor Ortega and Vice Mayor Whitehead noted that Karen was retiring at the end of May and thanked her for service to Scottsdale.

Public Comment time is reserved for Scottsdale citizens, business owners, and/or property owners to comment on non-agendized items that are within the Council's jurisdiction. No official Council action can be taken on these items. Advocacy for or against a candidate or ballot measure during a Council meeting is not allowed pursuant to State law and is therefore not deemed to be within the Council's jurisdiction.

Public Comment time is also the designated time for presenting a citizen petition. There is no limit on the number of petitions a citizen may present; however, each citizen is limited to a total time of three minutes to present and speak to the petition(s). A Request to Speak [form](#) must be submitted together with the petition(s) before the Mayor announces the second Public Comment period.

Speakers may address the Council once under Public Comment at the beginning or the end of the meeting, but not both. Public Comment is limited to a total of 15 minutes at the beginning and 15 minutes at the end of the meeting. **Speakers are limited to three minutes to address the Council during “Public Comment.”**

5. **Fiscal Year (FY) 2024/25 Human Services Program Funding – Approved on Consent.**

Request: Adopt **Resolution No. 13100** approving the recommendations of the Human Services Advisory Commission and authorizing:

1. The allocation of FY 2024/25 Scottsdale Cares Program funding, in the amount of \$111,937, to agencies supporting a variety of human services programs.
2. The allocation of FY 2024/25 General Fund, in the amount up to \$100,000, to agencies supporting a variety of human services programs.
3. The allocation of FY 2024/25 Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community funds, in the amount of \$97,500, supporting home delivered and congregate meals.
4. The distribution of Scottsdale Endowment Program funding, in the amount of \$8,600, to two different agencies, the McDowell Sonoran Conservancy for their Expedition Days: Expedition Days Live Suite and the Arizona Burn Foundation.
5. The Assistant City Manager, or designee, to execute contracts with non-profit agencies for programs and services that do not exceed the formal bid limit of \$50,000.

6. Infrastructure Reimbursement Agreement

Request: Adopt **Resolution No. 13130** to authorize:

1. Infrastructure Reimbursement Agreement No. 2023-145-COS-A1 with McDowell Mountain Village Declarant, LLC (“Optima”), for sewer construction and cost reimbursement to design and construct sewer transmission mains between Scottsdale Road and the TPC sewer interceptor.
2. Fiscal Year 2023/24 Capital Improvement Plan Budget Transfers of up to \$11,000,000 from the Frank Lloyd Wright 24-inch Transmission Main & Booster Station 83B Modifications (WC03A), SROG Regional Wastewater Facilities (VF04A), and Zone 14/16 Water System Improvements Phase 2 (WH23A) capital projects to the Greenway Hayden Loop Sewer Improvements (VJ01) capital project to be funded by Sewer Rates.
3. A Fiscal Year 2023/24 General Fund Capital Contingency Budget Appropriation Transfer of up to \$8,000,000 to the Greenway Hayden Loop Sewer Improvements (VJ01) capital project to be funded by Sewer Rates.
4. Necessary adjustments to the Fiscal Year 2024/25 Capital Improvement Plan, including a budget transfer of up to \$4,000,000 from the Reclamation Plant Expansion (TEMP2974) capital project to partially restore Sewer and Water capital contingencies.
5. The City Manager, or designee, to execute any such documents and take any such other actions as necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution and Agreement.

– The Council then voted on the original motion which carried 6/1, with Mayor Ortega; Vice Mayor Whitehead; and Councilmembers Caputi, Durham, Janik, and Littlefield voting in the affirmative and Councilmember Graham dissenting.

7. Scottsdale Community Sustainability Plan

Request: Adopt **Resolution No. 13107** approving the Scottsdale Community Sustainability Plan.

– Sustainability Director Lisa McNeilly gave a PowerPoint presentation on the proposed Scottsdale Community Sustainability Plan.

– Mayor Ortega opened public comment on this item.

- Jim Davis, with the Coalition of Greater Scottsdale, requested fiscal sustainability be added to the Sustainability Plan and noted that Scottsdale is underinvesting in its assets' maintenance.
- Austin Fairbanks, Scottsdale resident, stated the Sustainability Plan would have no major impact on the environment at large, yet would be costly to implement.
- Patricia Badenoch spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan and noted concerns about the wording in the Plan.
- Paul Rowe spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan and its potential impacts to quality of life.
- Robbie Louchheim spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan.
- Jim Haxby spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan due to increased costs to residents without a clear benefit.
- Bob Pejman spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan, noting the Plan did not address overdevelopment.
- Geoff Kull spoke in opposition to the Sustainability Plan due to potential rate increases and restrictions on individuals.
- Mayor Ortega closed public comment and noted there were a number of written comments submitted on this item.
- Councilmember Durham made a motion to continue Resolution No. 13107 to a later date to allow additional community outreach with at least two community outreach meetings being scheduled by city staff. Councilwoman Janik seconded the motion, which carried 7/0, with Mayor Ortega; Vice Mayor Whitehead; and Councilmembers Caputi, Durham, Graham, Janik, and Littlefield voting in the affirmative.
