WHEREAS, The City of Scottsdale strongly supports the proposition that Indigenous Peoples' Day be an opportunity to uplift the cultures and values of the Indigenous Peoples' of our state; and

WHEREAS, The City of Scottsdale appreciates our Indigenous community and the strong relationships we have with our neighboring tribal communities and those throughout the state.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. J. "Jim" Lane Mayor of the City of Scottsdale do hereby proclaim October 12, 2020 as


"Indigenous Peoples' Day"
