- Hashknife Pony Express 11 a.m.-1p.m. Friday, Feb. 2. The oldest officially sanctioned Pony Express celebrates with riders blazing their trail from the tiny town of Holbrook, Arizona. At high noon, welcome their arrival at Scottsdale's Museum of the West as they conclude a 200-mile trek with more than 20,000 pieces of mail. Get Involved!

Scottsdale's public involvement team continues to drive citywide efforts to expand methods of public feedback to reach and hear from more voices in the community as issues are explored and decisions are made.

In the past year, the city adopted a handful of new technologies to bring new life to community engagement in Scottsdale:

- The Hello Scottsdale platform allows people to provide feedback via text/SMS. Several hundred residents provided feedback via the tool when the city asked for input about a new off-leash dog area coming next year to Thompson Peak Park.
- Speak Up Scottsdale a hosted online community that provides a new space to weigh-in on city issues, programs, services and projects. Residents recently provided feedback on noise, homelessness and food waste.
- Residents over the past year used the Polco online questionnaire platform nearly 13,000 times to provide feedback about various topics such as a new water-saving landscape ordinance, the draft Sustainability Plan and the new Short-Term Rental Resource Center Map.

Investing in Our Scottsdale: City breaks ground on Ashler Hills Park



Amenities for the 17-acre park, located at Ashler Hills Drive and 74th Way, include open turf play areas, a shaded playground, restrooms, lighted sport courts, walking paths and trails, exercise equipment, lighted parking and public art. Northern Scottsdale golf courses stay green with reclaimed water

With all eyes on the city with the WM Phoenix Open at TPC Scottsdale, spectators from around the world will be seeing expansive green golf courses in the heart of the desert. It is important to know that 23 of the city's northern courses use reclaimed water, including TPC. These courses also have helped fund the construction and operation of the Reclaimed Water Distribution System, allowing Scottsdale Water to not only use recycled water for irrigation and to replenish the aquifer, but to keep rates lower for customers.

The distribution system is a complex water system capable of delivering 20 million gallons of non-potable water -- water not suitable for drinking -- each day for turf irrigation. This same water is used to supply reclaimed water to the city's Bell94 Sports Complex and the Scottsdale Sports Complex.

In the non-peak months when the courses do not need their full water allotments, the city further treats the excess water from the Advanced Water Treatment Facility to recharge our aquifer. This allows Scottsdale to increase its water savings and build long-term water sustainability.
