

CITY OF SCOTTSDALE – OFFICE OF THE MAYOR Amendment No. 1 to Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of March, 2020, Mayor W.J. "Jim" Lane issued a Proclamation Declaring an Emergency within the City of Scottsdale (the "City") in response to the spread of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

WHEREAS, the City has been working with federal, state, and local governmental authorities and with schools, businesses, non-profits, medical facilities, and faith groups within the City to combat and reduce the spread of the COVID-19 outbreak and to assist our community and its citizens with the effects of the COVID-19 outbreak.

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2020, President Trump unveiled Guidelines for Opening Up America Again, a three-phased approach for lifting government restrictions put in place in response to COVID-19.

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona, Douglas A. Ducey, on April 29, 2020, amended through Executive Order 2020-33, his *Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected Order* and continued this Order until May 15, 2020. This new Order also began a gradual reopening and recovery of Arizona by allowing a limited reopening of non-essential retail on May 4, 2020 and more robust reopening on May 8, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona, Douglas A. Ducey, on May 12, 2020 issued Executive Order 2020-36 rescinding his *Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected Order*. Under Executive Order 2020-36, the Governor established guidelines to *Stay Healthy, Return Smarter, Return Stronger* beginning a phased reopening of Arizona.

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency in Arizona due to the COVID-19 outbreak continues to exist.

WHEREAS, the City is developing a City of Scottsdale COVID-19 Recovery Plan consistent with federal guidelines and the State of Arizona's reopening guidance to provide for the phased resumption of City operations and City services.

WHEREAS, the City intends to take further actions to protect the public health and safety during this local, state, and national public health emergency and implement additional measures to begin a phased resumption of City operations and City services to continue mitigating the spread of COVID-19 and protecting the health and safety of City employees, residents, visitors and businesses.

WHEREAS, Mayor Lane now finds it necessary to issue Amendment No. 1 to the Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency to promote a reopening and recovery of the City.

WHEREAS, all other provisions of the original Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency not in conflict with this Amendment No. 1 will remain in full force and effect until the emergency declared herein abates and is withdrawn; and

NOW, THEREFORE, as Mayor of the City of Scottsdale, County of Maricopa, State of Arizona, pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-301, *et. seq.*, and Scottsdale Revised Code § 10-3, I do hereby:

- 1. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-311(B), additional proclamations or amendments may be issued in the future to impose all necessary regulations to preserve the peace and order of the City. This Amendment shall be effective immediately and shall remain in effect until a termination of the original Proclamation is filed with the City Clerk.
- 2. Effective May 16, 2020, the City Manager shall begin to more fully reopen outdoor City park amenities in conformance with the guidelines established by the Governor's Executive Order 2020-36 to the extent reasonably practicable. The City Manager shall also begin to more fully resume City events, programs, sports, and classes in phases and in conformance with the Governor's Executive Orders and the City's recovery plan to the extent reasonably practicable. City employees shall also continue a phased return to work on City premises under the City Manager's direction and pursuant to the City's recovery plan.
- 3. Effective May 18, 2020, the City Manager shall begin to more fully reopen City buildings and facilities that are normally open to the public in phases and in conformance with the guidelines established by the Governor's Executive Order 2020-36 to the extent reasonably practicable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, some buildings, including City Hall, have unique architecture and design that make conformance to the Governor's Executive Orders problematic. Efforts are currently underway to rectify these instances in a timely fashion in order to comply with the Governor's Executive Orders.
- Pursuant to the City Manager's previous orders, the Civic Center Mall area and the immediate area around City Hall will remain closed during the time periods specified in said orders.
- 5. All residents, business owners, and leaders of places of worship and social organizations are urged to continue practices to limit and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 in adherence with the Governor's Executive Orders.
- 6. All other provisions of the original Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency not in conflict with this Amendment No. 1 will remain in full force and effect until the declared emergency is terminated.
- The Original Proclamation and Amendment No. 1 shall remain in place until further notice and shall be reconsidered for repeal or revision every two weeks following issuance.
