

Watercolor
with Charles Taylor

Supplies

1. No. 2 stranded school pencil to take notes or to do drawing with.
- 2 Graphite paper to trace your subject onto your watercolor paper.
- 3 Cheep set of water soluble pencils.
- 4 140 lb. watercolor paper, cold press.
5. I recommend a set of "Reeve's" set of 24 tube watercolors, they are cheep and good. You can buy separate colors as needed.
6. A pallet to hold the 24 colors with a mixing area.
7. Ink easer.
8. A small container to hold water.
- 9 Masking Fluid.
10. Bar of soap to clean you brushes.
11. "Parker" fountain pen ink.
12. Soft tissue like Charmin bath tissue.
13. Hair dryer.
14. Single edge razor blade for scarping.
15. Something with a hard paint, like a cheep compass.
16. Brushes:
Dagger 5/8" with "Tacklon" bristles. If you can not find the dagger brush then a round brush that come to a fine point when wet.
Rigger or long hair liner brush #2 or #3 size.
Fan brush with "Tacklon" bristles.
