Community members were asked to share their thoughts on "Connection &

Engagement Questionnaire".

REPORT SUMMARY

59 participants completed this activity, demographics of respondents can be found at the end of the report. NOTE: This was a small sample size, results and recommendations are not conclusive and themes that emerged should be further explored/validated.

Overall, SUS participants view the City of Scottsdale positively and describe the local government as proactive and communicative. While there are many avenues of communication, and opportunities for participation and engagement, some expressed frustration that their opinions are not necessarily heard. SUS members believe local government has the biggest impact on their quality of life and appreciate opportunities to express opinions and collaborate in Scottsdale's growth.

Q#1 (59 respondents)

Respondents were asked, "On a scale of 1 to 5, how strongly do you agree with the following statement? 1Strongly disagree, 5Strongly agree The City of Scottsdale provides opportunities for participation, interaction and dialogue from Scottsdale residents on important issues."

72.9% of respondents rated the concept 4 or 5. While 8.5% of respondents rated the concept 1 or 2. The average rating was 3.98.

Q#2 (59 respondents)

Respondents were asked, "Why do you feel that way about how Scottsdale engages with residents on important issues?"

The City provides opportunities to engage

- · Scottsdale actively communicates with residents email, newsletters, social media, website (25)
- Many opportunities to attend meetings, open houses, workshops (14)
- City encourages feedback + SUS provides platform to engage (12)

Opportunities for Improvement

- While there are opportunities to participate, residents don't feel listened to or represented (11)
- · Scottsdale could communicate to wider audience (3)

Q#3 (59 respondents)

Respondents were asked, "What is your most preferred method of receiving information about important city issues?"

- Email (78.0%)
- Direct Mail (10.2%)
- Other, please specify (5.1%)*
- Text Message (5.1%)
- Cable Channel 11 (1.7%)

*Other includes local news, attending city meetings, social media

Q#4 (59 respondents)

Respondents were asked, "What does local government mean to you?"

Perceptions of Local Government

- Government officials that represent citizens must have close engagement with residents to support community needs (26)
- Most important level of Government Directly impacts daily life (17)
- Public Services, Safety, Infrastructure (Schools, fire, utilities, etc.) (12)



Q#5 (59 respondents)

Respondents were asked, "On a scale of 1 to 5, how would you rate your impression of Scottsdales local government? ? 1Poor, 5Excellent" 61.0% of respondents rated the concept 4 or 5. While 22.0% of respondents rated the concept 1 or 2. The average rating was 3.58.



Respondents were asked, "How involved would you like to be in Scottsdales local government?"


- Sometimes (54.2%)






















Connection & Engagement Discussion

SUS participants had a wide set of opinions on what "community connection and engagement" meant to them. However the overarching theme that emerged is community connection and engagement is ideally an open dialogue between residents and the city that can allow for collaborative planning. Below are the themes that emerged from this discussion topic:

What community connection and engagement means to SUS residents:

- · City officials consider resident feedback in planning + Transparent and communicate plans (14)
- Participating and getting involved + Having a sense of ownership (9)
- Engaging in meaningful discussions + Working together to improve the community (8)
- Building relationships with those of similar interests (4)
- Experiencing events in all areas of Scottsdale, beyond Old Town (4)
