




OVERVIEW

On January 23, 2024, Parks and Recreation discussion went live. The Scottsdale Parks & Recreation discussion asked SUS members to identify the amenity, programs, facility, service, etc. not currently available but desired.

- 82 community members participated.
- The questionnaire closed on March 15, 2024.

This report provides a summary of the discussion themes.









AMENITY/PROGRAM/FACILITY/SERVICE/ ETC MOST DISCUSSED

Speak Up Scottsdale members desire enhancements in parks, including more green spaces, shaded areas, and environmental initiatives like tree planting for education and their benefit. Safety improvements through better lighting and secure pathways are suggested. Community-driven amenities like outdoor stages for local musicians, book swaps, and community gardens resonate, alongside infrastructure requests for bike lanes and trash disposal facilities. Maintaining existing beauty while innovating for community and environmental health is a shared value.








AMENITY/PROGRAM/FACILITY/SERVICE/ETC MOST DISCUSSED

- Environmental and Community Preservation
- Expansion and Enhancement of Recreational Spaces
