Fire Station 613 opens in Desert Foothills

After operating from a "temporary" modular facility for more than 20 years, Scottsdale fire crews serving the Desert Foothills area around Hayden and Jomax roads moved into their new station in July.

The facility provides modern working and living spaces for personnel and their equipment. Plus, its location will improve response times for residents and businesses in the area. The \$5.1 million project was funded with general obligation bonds approved by Scottsdale voters in 2015; the bonds will be repaid through the secondary property tax.

Scottsdale voters go to the polls Nov. 6

Scottsdale voters will elect three City Council members at the Tuesday, Nov. 6, General Election. The Scottsdale City Council also has called a Special Election to run concurrently with

the Nov. 6 General Election, so voters can consider these ballot questions:

Question 1—A ballot question authorizing an increase in the rate of transaction privilege and use taxes in the city by 0.10 percent (0.10%) for a period of ten (10) years to provide funds for transportation improvement projects. The tax amounts to one penny on every \$10 purchase in Scottsdale.

Proposition 420—An amendment to the Scottsdale City Charter proposed by initiative petition. This proposition would amend the City Charter to prohibit the alteration of the natural state of preserve lands and limit the use of preserve funds for any purpose other than those specifically outlined in the proposed amendment unless authorized by Scottsdale registered voters at a general or special election.

Navy Top Gun and Vietnam veteran will speak at Scottsdale's Veterans Day Commemoration, Nov. 9

Capt. Larry Ernst, United States Navy, retired, will be the keynote speaker at the city's annual Veterans Day commemoration. A fighter pilot during the Vietnam War, Ernst flew more than 100 combat missions from the deck of the USS Kitty Hawk.



During more than 25 years of military service, he accumulated more than 4,500 hours of flying time in 36 different aircraft and served as both a test pilot and as a fighter pilot instructor at the Navy's famed TOP GUN program. He also commanded two fighter squadrons and was the final commanding officer of the aircraft carrier USS Midway, prior to its decommissioning and eventual rebirth as a floating museum.
