

**CITY OF SCOTTSDALE
NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
FY 2026-2027 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN**

The City of Scottsdale Human Services Commission will hold a public hearing February 12, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. to obtain citizen input on its use of the Fiscal Year 2026/2027 Community Development Block Grant and its Annual Action Plan at City Hall located at 3939 N. Drinkwater Blvd. Scottsdale, AZ. 85251.

The City of Scottsdale anticipates receiving \$1,056,457 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding allocation. The CDBG funds may be used for the following activities and must benefit qualifying individual families who are low and moderate income:

1. Public Services
2. Housing Rehabilitation
3. Acquisition of Real Property
4. Public Facilities
5. Economic Development
6. Planning and Administration.

The City of Scottsdale anticipates receiving \$293,975 in HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME) funding allocation. The HOME funds may be used for the following activities and must benefit qualifying individual families who are low and moderate income:

1. Homeowner (owner-occupied) rehabilitation
2. Rental housing acquisition, new construction, or rehabilitation
3. Homebuyer housing acquisition, new construction, or rehabilitation, including direct assistance to eligible homebuyers to purchase the housing
4. Tenant-based rental assistance (rental subsidy)

Prior to a submission of an Annual Action Plan outlining the use of the CDBG funds, the City of Scottsdale must hold a public meet to receive input and comments regarding the use of these funds and eligible activities. Citizens are encouraged to comment on the use of the CDBG funds on February 12, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. through the City of Scottsdale Human Services Commission or by emailing Chad Beougher, Community Development Supervisor at cbeougher@scottsdaleaz.gov.
