Strong roots start in the fall



If your plants look tired after summer, it may be time for replacements. Fall is the best season to plant in Scottsdale — the cooler weather allows roots to establish, making plants stronger and better able to soak up beneficial rainwater.

For long-term success, choose Arizona-friendly plants that thrive with less water and care. Planting desert trees can provide filtered shade for sensitive species like agaves, helping soil stay cooler and moister. Shade cloth is another option when natural shade isn't available.

Today's landscaping trends favor low-water-use plants and smart placement over heavy watering. With the right choices, you can enjoy a vibrant, resilient yard year-round.

On Oct. 4, the community is invited to the park's Golden Jubilee celebration, part of the annual Railfair weekend. Enjoy live music, activities, historical displays and a commemorative ceremony honoring the park's legacy as one of Scottsdale's favorite spots for family fun over the last 50 years.



The festivities don't stop there. Enjoy some of Scottsdale's most popular family events throughout 2025:

- Halloween Spook-Track-ula (Oct. 10-31) A monthlong transformation of the train ride into a family-friendly haunted adventure.
- Holiday Lights (Nov. 29 Dec. 30) A dazzling holiday tradition featuring festive displays and a train ride through a winter wonderland.
- Noon Year's Eve (Dec. 31) A daytime New Year's celebration for families with a train ride, music, activities and a "noon" countdown.

This summer, the park opened several highly anticipated features designed to enhance the visitor experience year-round, including a 10,000-square-foot train-themed indoor play space, a 5,000-square-foot splashpad play area and new entry plaza.
